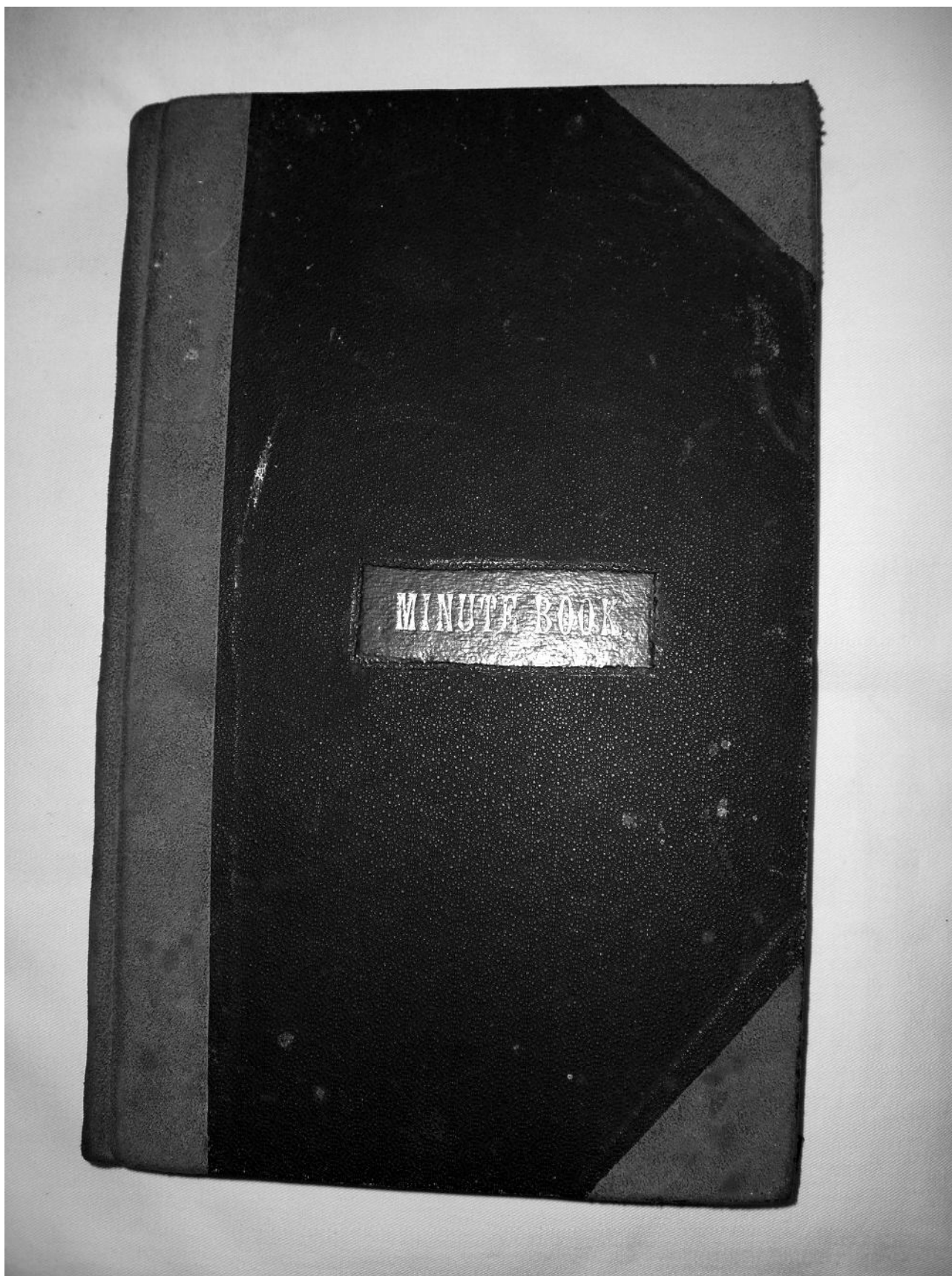

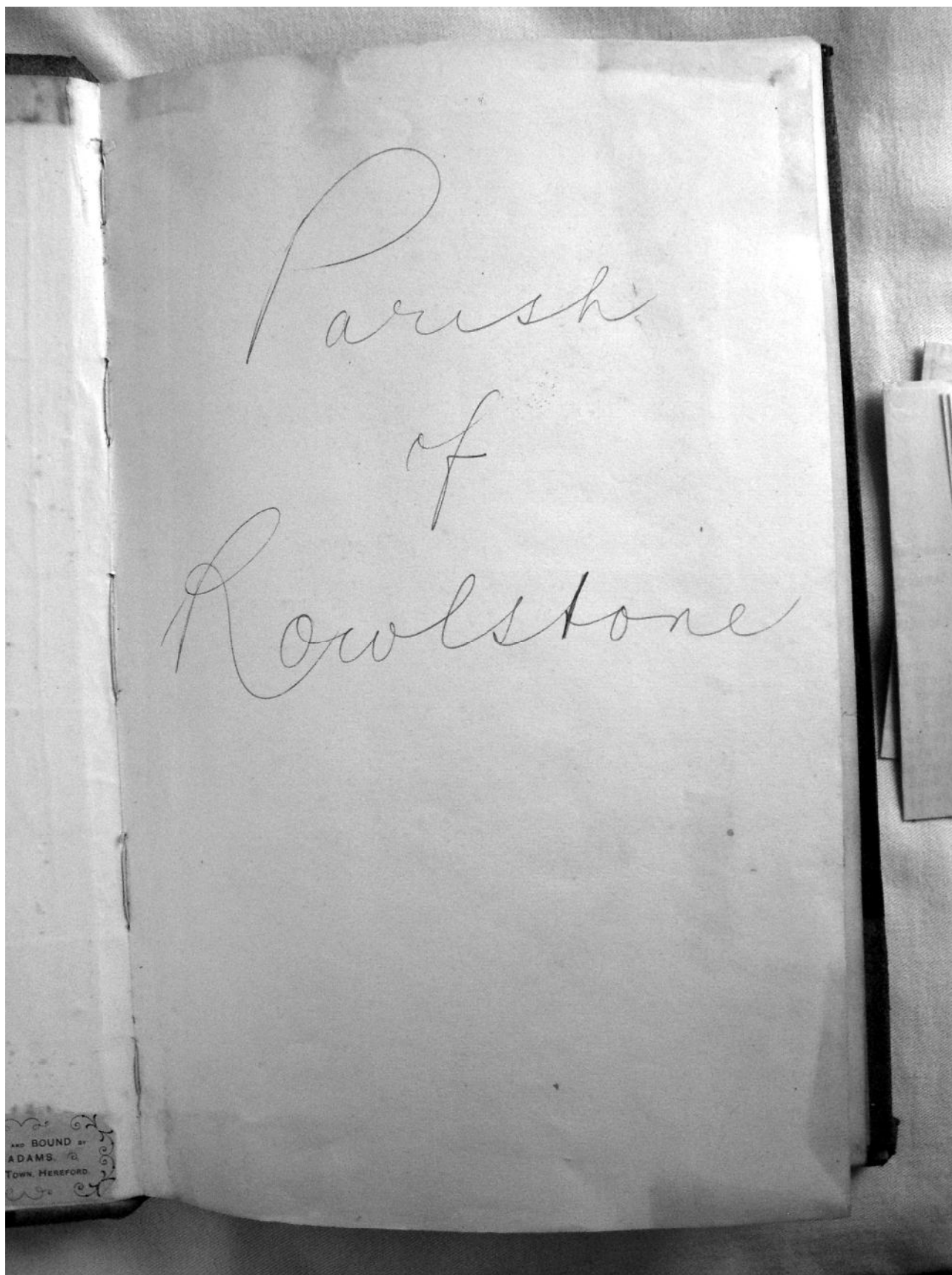

Coronation of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

Coronation Souvenirs, etc.

With reference to my letter to you of 15th instant, I set out below a copy of a letter dated 16th December 1952, which I have received from the Director of Education.

" Thank you for your letter of the 13th December. The Advisory Committee met yesterday afternoon and decided to award a Souvenir Spoon to all children in attendance at maintained schools, with the exception that where a Council has already placed an order for some other Souvenir, reimbursement will be made to that Council of a sum equivalent to the cost of the spoons for the children in attendance at Schools in that area. I am communicating with the Clerks of Councils who have written to me."

Dear Sir, or Madam,

#### Coronation Souvenirs and Festivities.

1. I am directed to inform you that the Education Finance and General Purposes Sub-Committee decided at a meeting on Wednesday, 3rd December to recommend the Education Committee to rescind their previous decision and to present a Coronation Souvenir to all children in attendance at maintained Schools within the County.

The Education Committee is due to meet on January 31st 1953. In the meantime an early meeting of the Teachers Joint Advisory Committee will be held to consider what the Education Committee's Souvenir shall be.

The decision to give a Coronation Souvenir has been made since the receipt from the Ministry of Education of a Circular stating that expenditure of a sum not exceeding 2/- per head on the number of children in Maintained Schools in January, 1953 will be recognised for grant from the Ministry.

It should be noted that Souvenirs will not be presented to Children who are not in Maintained Schools - namely children in attendance at Private Schools and such Schools as the Cathedral School, Lucton School, or the High School, Ross-on-Wye.

So soon as a choice of Souvenir has been made a further communication will be sent to state what it is to be, and dealing with the question of distribution.

2. The Committee have also decided to make the following recommendations:-

(a) That School playgrounds shall be made available for events such as neighbourhood tea-parties.

(b) That School Canteen equipment shall be made available for Children's and Old People's tea or supper parties, subject to an undertaking by the organisers of such parties that they will make good to the satisfaction of the Education Committee, any damage or breakage, and subject also to the Head Teacher or Canteen Supervisor or Assistant being a Member of the responsible organising committee.

A meeting to receive the report of the delegates  
appointed at last meeting to interview the Local  
District Council and to consider what further steps  
should be taken in the matter of improving the condition  
of Panylen Pitch. There were present: Mr John Williams,  
(Chairman), Rev. A. Haines, Messrs Jones, Jones, Thomas Jones,  
W. J. Jones, and W. J. Jones.

The report of the delegates having been received, the  
Rev. A. Haines proposed that the Chairman be requested to  
interview Mr H. P. Jones of Jones Harold, representative of  
that parish on the District Council, with a view to gaining his  
support in having improvements effected on Panylen Pitch.  
Mr Jones seconded and it was carried unanimously.  
Mr Jones proposed and Mr Jones seconded and it  
was agreed that the Council be requested to assign  
a representative on the District Council to the parish of  
Rowelstone.

With reference to the share from Thurston, it was  
decided that Mr Jones provide half a ton of coal  
for Mrs Parry of Ball's Cross and retain the balance of

the share in case any need should arise later on.

March 7<sup>th</sup> 1899

A meeting of the parishioners was held in the Villa  
on the above date to consider the advisability of being  
unanimous as to the nomination of a candidate to fill  
the position of first District Councillor and Guardian  
for the parish of Rowelstone.

Mr John Williams (Prop) proposed that Mr W. J. Jones be the  
candidate, Mr Philip Williams (Panylen Pitch) seconded.

Mr W. J. Jones proposed Mr Philip Williams and Mr John  
seconded.

It was agreed that both gentlemen should be nominated  
in case of any difficulty arising as to the first named  
candidate's standing.

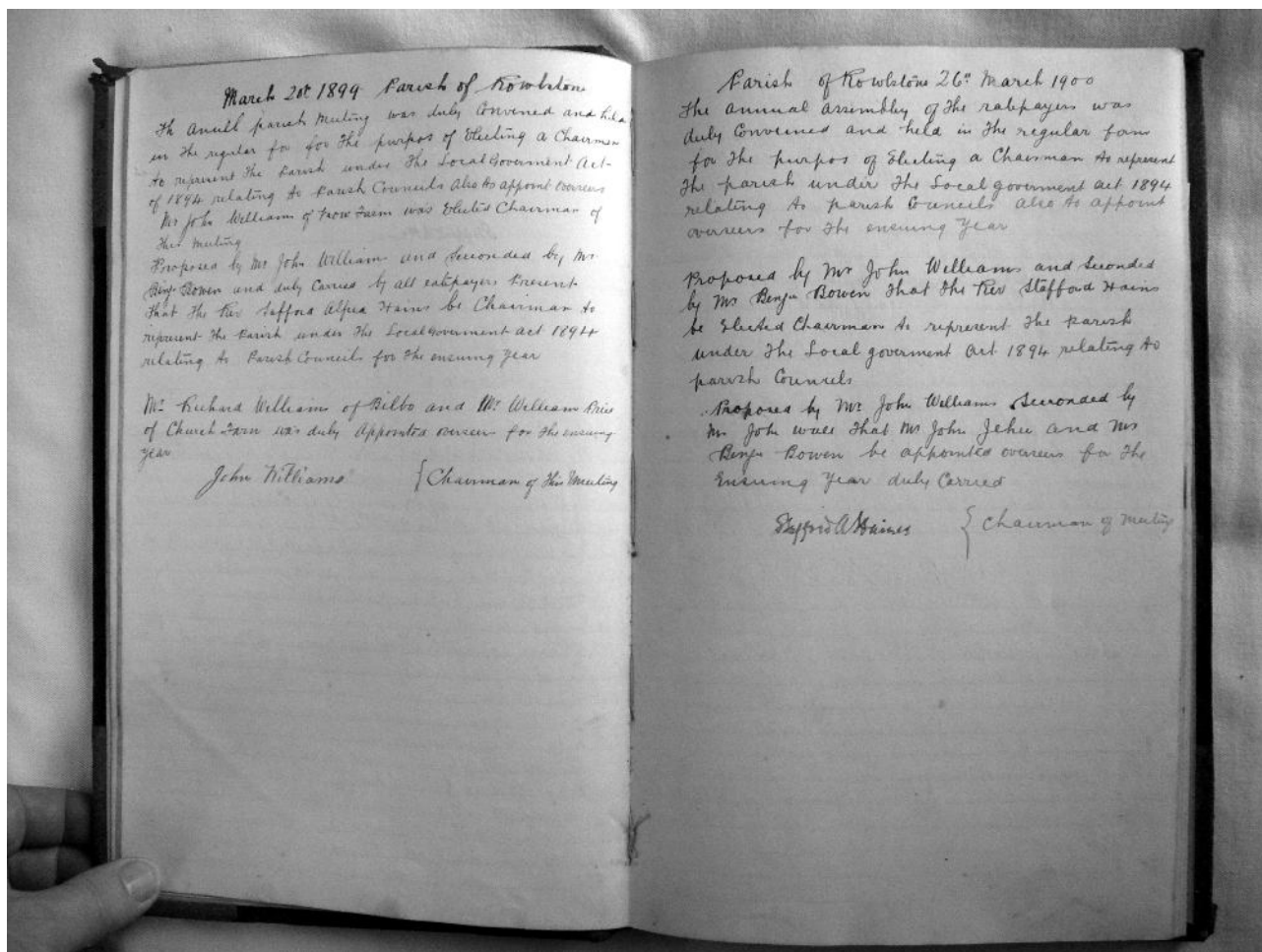
Mr Jones's nomination paper was signed by Messrs

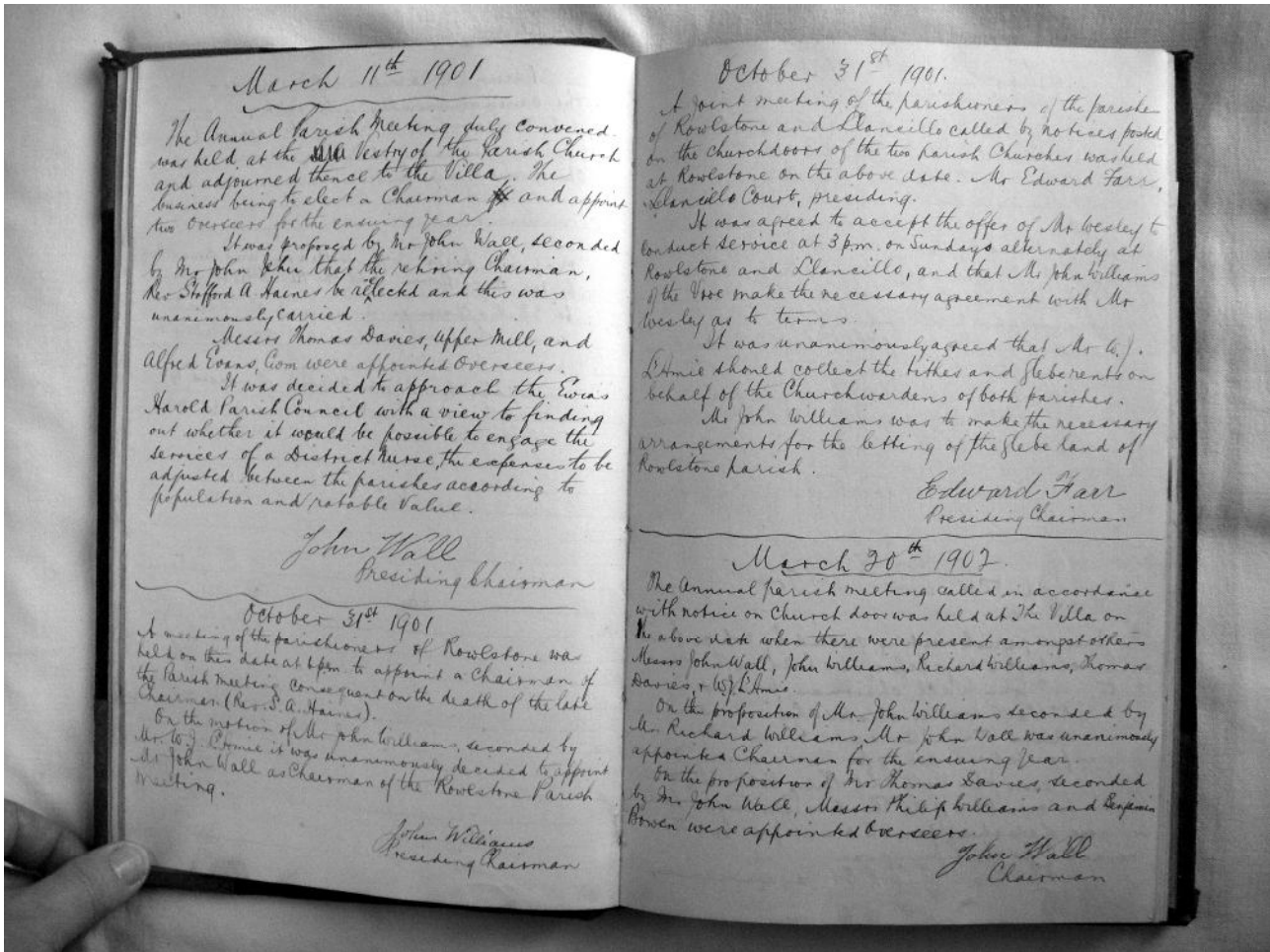
