1900 April 20th The annual Vestry meeting, duly convened by a notice on Charch doos, was held in the Vestry of the Church, but in consequence of the Sacred Here difice being in process of restoration the meeting was adjourned to the Villa. There was no opposition to messos John williams and Philip Williams as Churchwards for ensuing year and they were consequently reelected. Mr L'Amie made a statement as to the position of the Restoration work and submitted certain proposals as to matters requiring attention which had been discovered subsequently to the acceptance of the lender, and it was agreed that he should have the necessary work done. of the Thruaton Chanty for the four years ending Easter 1898 and that he had spent 's of it for coal for more Parry, + had Tof shill in hand. It was considered advisable to make application each year for this charity and the matter was left in the heads of the John Williams. on of the Wardens, was unevoidably absent through Wy Amie, chi illness.
