The Court Baron of the Right Hon^{ble} W^m Lord Abregaconny Lord
of the Manner held at the Castle of Longtown in and for the Manner
upon Thursday / to wit the 15th Day of December in the Eleventh year

God King of Great Britain France and Ireland Defender of the
Faith and so forth and in the year of our Lord 1737 before
Job Gilbert Esq^r Deputy Steward of

At this Court it is Presented by the Jury of Homage that W^m Hockyns Esq^r late a
Customary Tenant of the Manner aforesaid who led to him and his heirs and assigns
of the end of this Manner aforesaid for the Lives of Tho^s John & Gabriel Hockyns Sons
of Sir John Hockyns Baron and the Ex^{ors} of the longest Liver of them according
to the Custom of the said Manner & Acres of Customary Land & Wth Measure with
the appurtenances lying and being in the Township of Capwall in the
parish of Ladoch within the Fee of this Manner heretofore and before this Court
did seize the said Tho^s John & Gabriel Hockyns by W^m Hockyns his
Attorney and prays to be admitted Tenant to the said Promises To which
said W^m Hockyns by his Attorney aforesaid the Lord of the said
Manner by his Steward did grant the said promises with the appurtenances
and delivered six in thirds of ~~the~~ by the Fee, but Fealty is not paid

thereof were heretofore due & are of right accustomed And the said Elizabeth Hannah
& Bridgett are admitted Tenants of the said Promises & have seized by the
Dad And the said Elizabeth Hannah have done Fealty but the Fealty of the said
Bridgett is respited untill &c

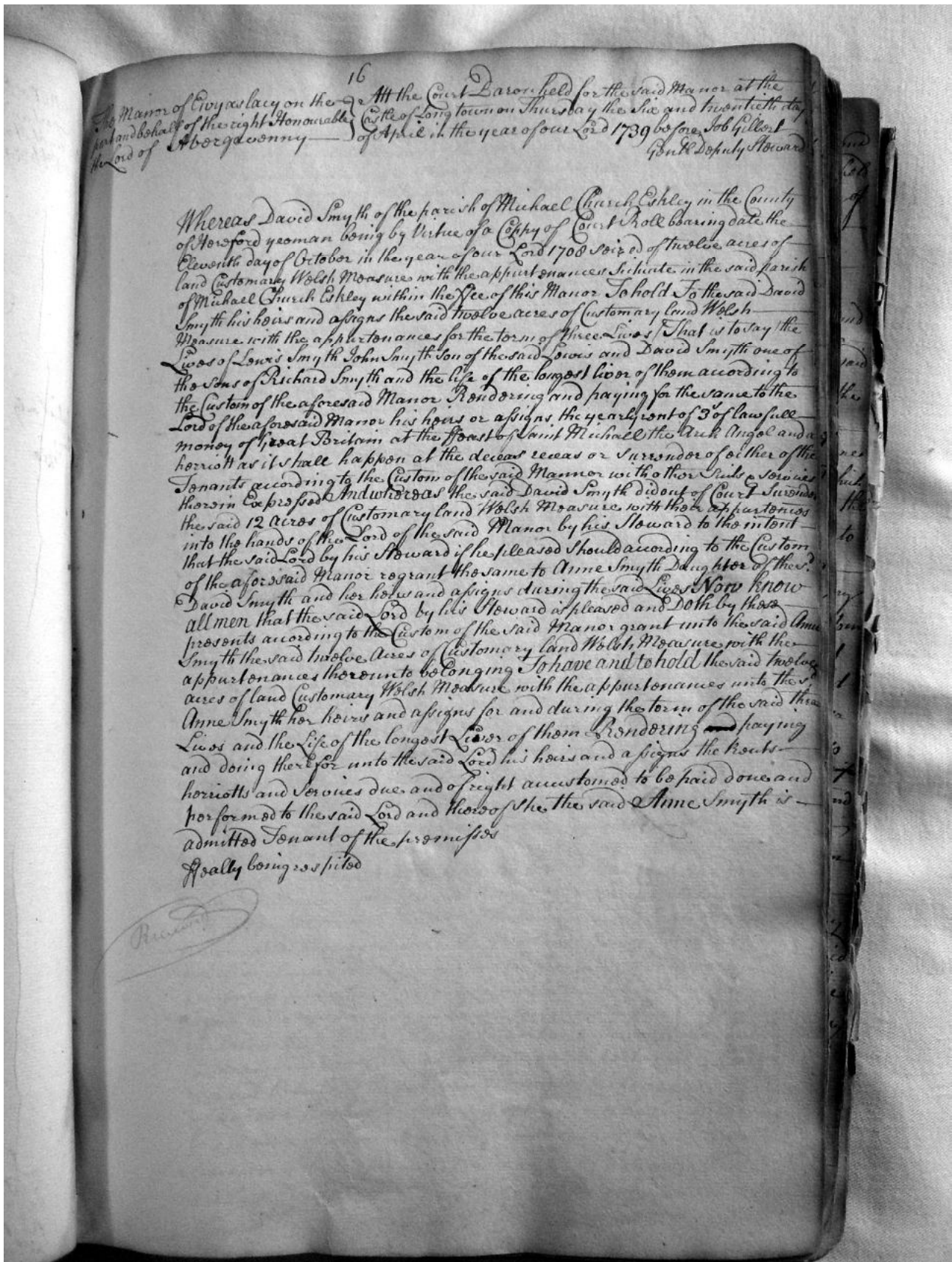
