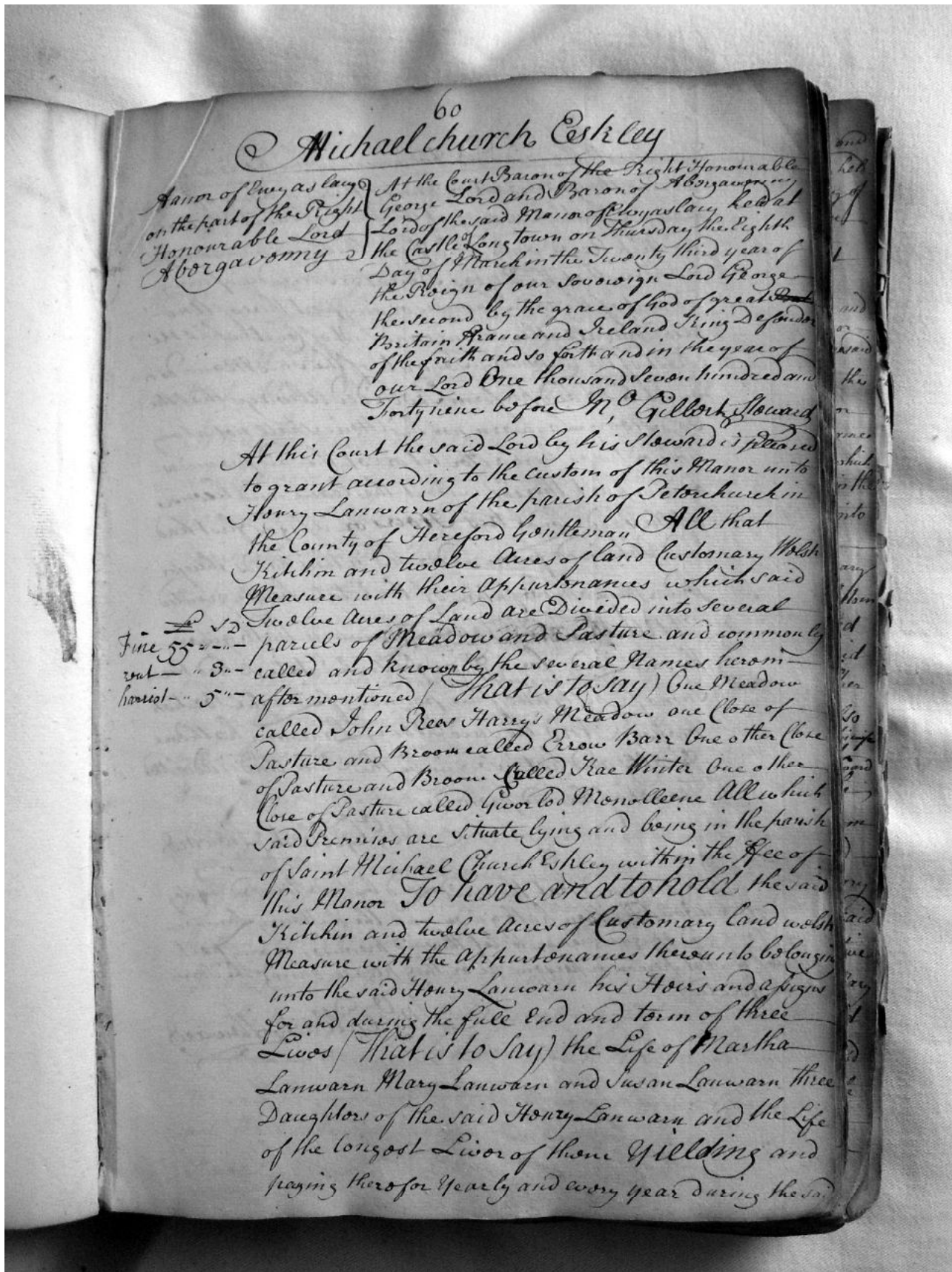

At the Court Baron of the Right Honourable Lord and Baron of Abzavorny on the part of the Right Honourable Lord George the said Baron of Abzavorny held at the Castle of Longtown on Thursday the eighth day of March in the Twenty third year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the second by the grace of God of great Britain France and Ireland King Defender of the faith and so forth and in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and forty nine before M^r Gilbert Howard

At this Court the said Lord by his Steward is pleased to grant according to the custom of this Manor unto Henry Lanwarn of the parish of Peterchurch in the County of Hereford Gentleman All that

Kitchen and twelve Acres of Land Customary Welsh Measure with their Appurtenances which said Twelve Acres of Land are Divided into several parcels of Meadow and Pasture and commonly called and known by the several Names hereinafter mentioned (That is to say) One Meadow called John Reas Harrys Meadow one Close of Pasture and Broom called Errow Barr one other Close of Pasture and Broom called Rae Winter one other Close of Pasture called Gwor lod Monolcene All which said Premises are situate lying and being in the parish of Saint Michael Church Eskley within the Fee of this Manor To have and to hold the said Kitchen and twelve Acres of Customary Land Welsh Measure with the Appurtenances therein to be longed unto the said Henry Lanwarn his Heirs and assigns for and during the full end and term of three Lives (That is to say) the Life of Martha Lanwarn Mary Lanwarn and Susan Lanwarn three Daughters of the said Henry Lanwarn and the Life of the longest Liver of them Yielding and paying therefor yearly and every year during the said



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Term into the said Lord Aborgaonny his heirs and
 assigns the yearly rent or sum of three shillings of
 Lawful british money at the Feast of Saint Michael
 the Arch Angel only and five shillings in name of
 an heriott at the Decays Reces or Surrender of every
 Tenant of the said Premises or any part thereof And
 also doing all other services and suit of Court which the
 Rest of the Customary Tenants of the said Manor do or
 ought to do and perform Provided Always that the
 said Henry Lanwarn nor his Heirs shall not at any
 time or times hereafter let or lot the said premises
 or any part thereof without the leave and license
 of the said Lord his Heirs or assigns first had
 and Obtained from under his or their hands therefor
 under pain of Forfeiture of the Estate hereby granted
 And the said Henry Lanwarn hath given
 the said Lord for a fine for such Estates so had the
 sum of Fifty and five pounds of Lawful British
 money And the said Henry Lanwarn hath done
 Fealty and hath sworn by the Oath And is admitted
 Tenant of the said premises

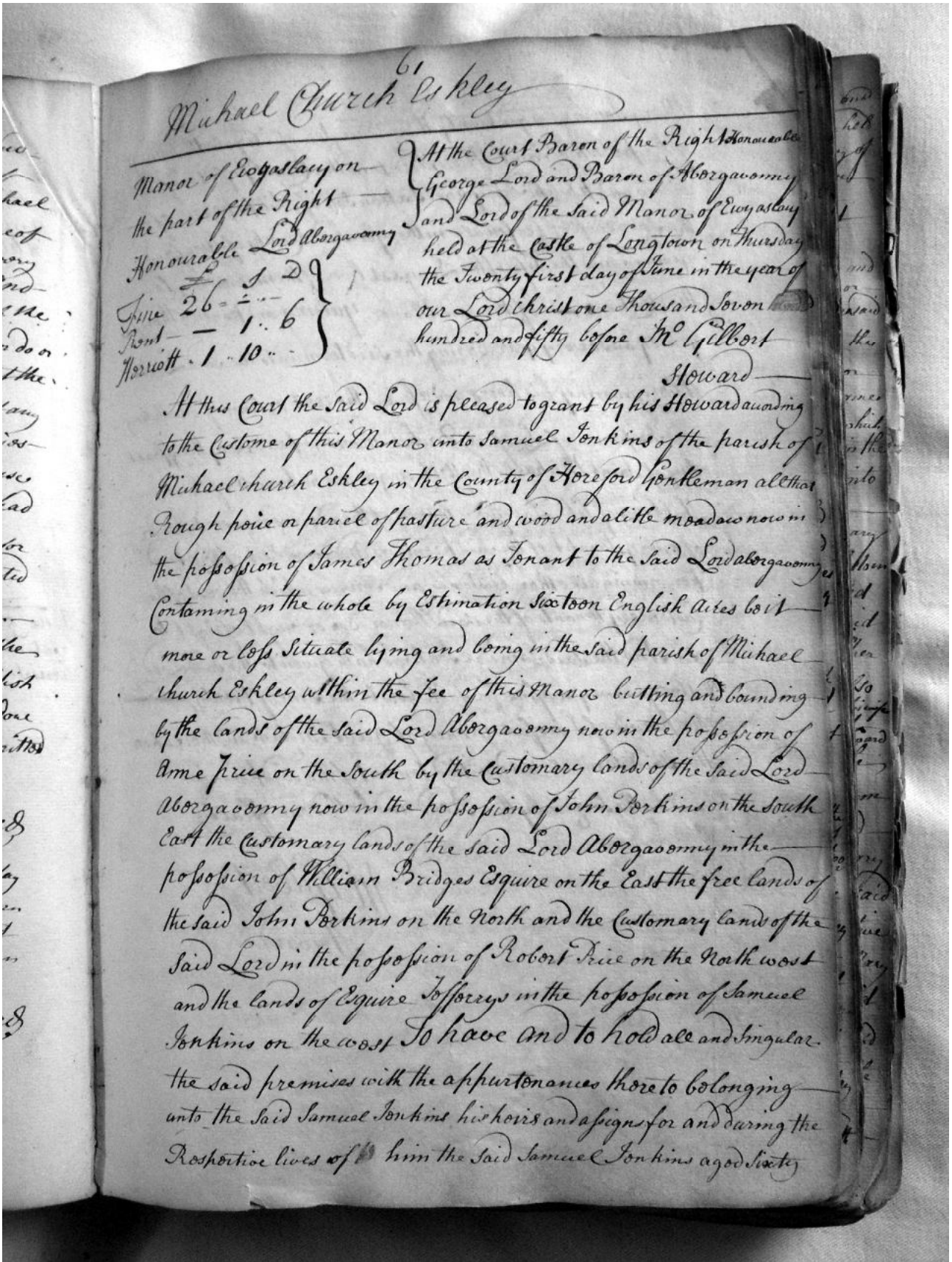

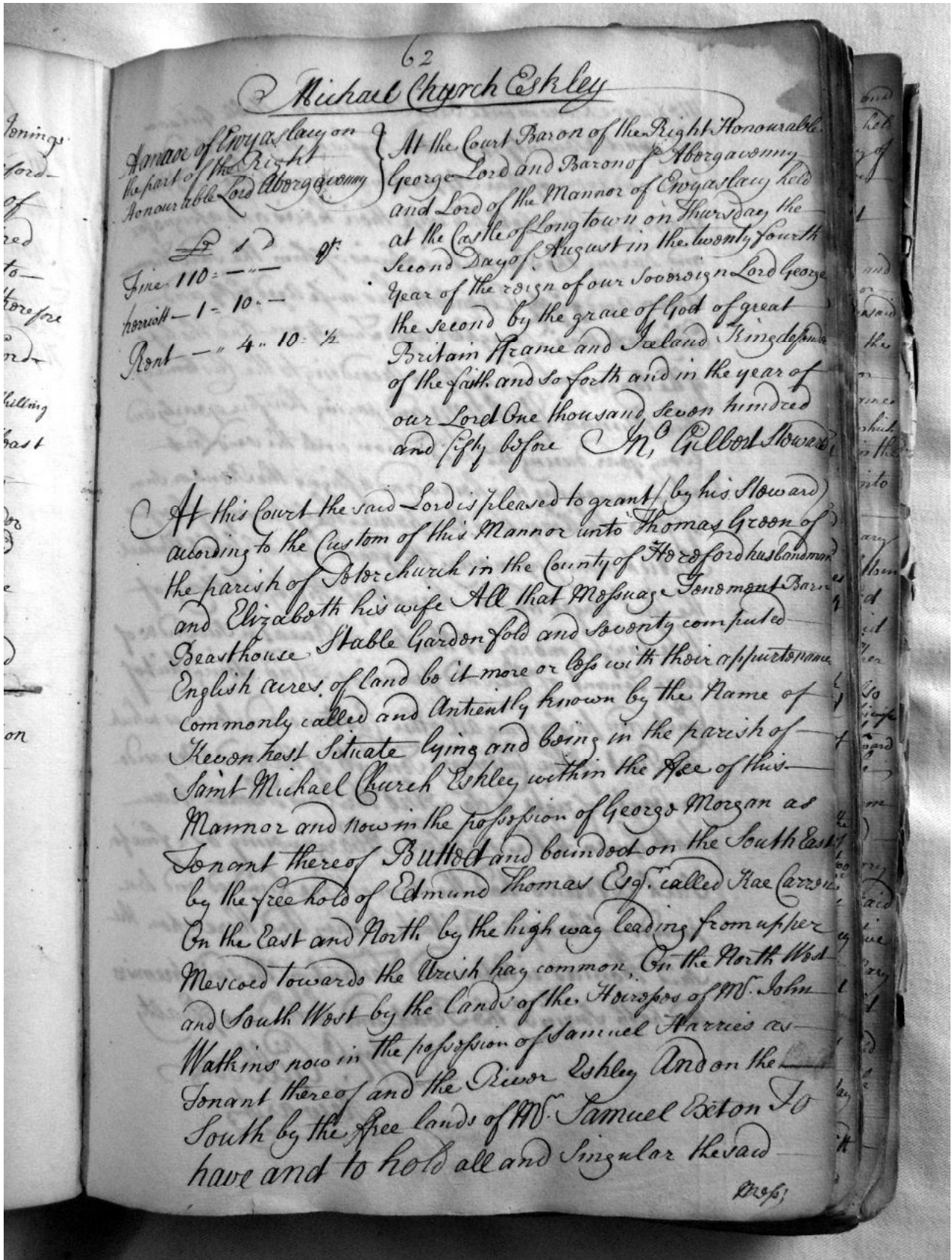

At this Court the said Lord is pleased to grant by his Howard awarding
to the Custome of this Manor unto Samuel Jonkins of the parish of
Michael church Eskley in the County of Hereford Gentleman all that
Rough poise or parcel of pasture and wood and a little meadow now in
the possession of James Thomas as Tenant to the said Lord Aborgaomy
Containing in the whole by Estimation sixteon English Acres or
more or less Situate lying and being in the said parish of Michael
church Eskley within the fee of this Manor butting and bounding
by the lands of the said Lord Aborgaomy now in the possession of
Arme Price on the South by the Customary lands of the said Lord
Aborgaomy now in the possession of John Portkins on the South
East the Customary lands of the said Lord Aborgaomy in the
possession of William Bridges Esquire on the East the free lands of
the said John Portkins on the North and the Customary lands of the
said Lord in the possession of Robert Price on the North west
and the lands of Esquire Joffereys in the possession of Samuel
Jonkins on the west To have and to hold all and singular
the said premises with the appurtenances thereto belonging
unto the said Samuel Jonkins his heirs and assigns for and during the
Respective lives of him the said Samuel Jonkins a good sixty



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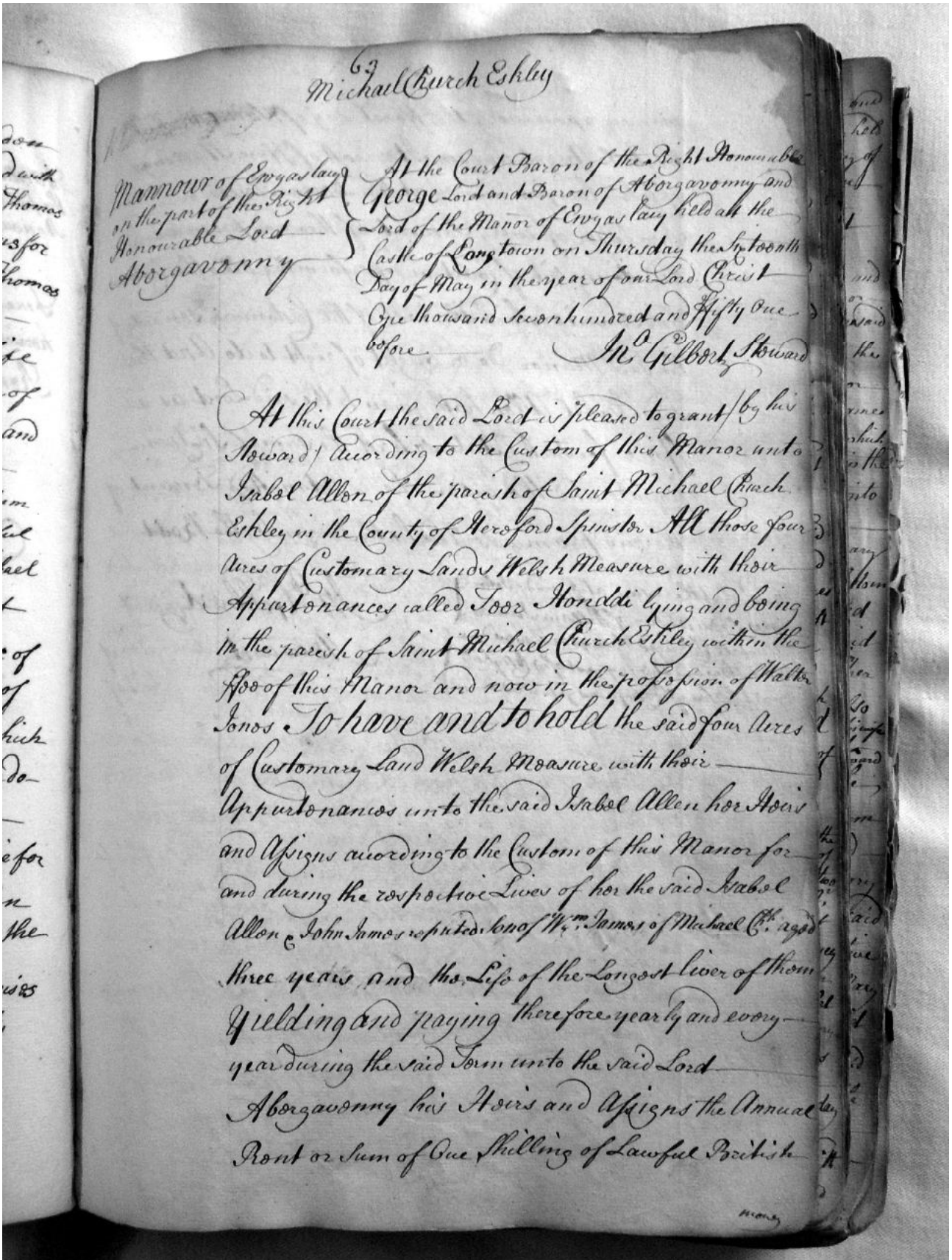
