 At the Court Barons of the Right Honourable George Lord
 and Baron of Abergaenny on Thursday the fourth day
 of July in the year of our Lord one Thousand seven
 Hundred and sixty eight before John Gilbert steward
 there
 Whereas John Price late of the Township of Lanseynoe in the parish of Cadoxton
 and County of Hereford yeoman. Deceased one of the Customary Tenants of the said
 Manor held to him and his heirs for the Term of the Natural Lives of James and William
 his two Sons and the life of the longest Liver of them by Copy of Court Role Dated
 the two and twentieth Day of January which was in the year of our Lord one
 Thousand seven Hundred and sixty one All those two ~~two~~ Acres of Customary
 Lands Welsh Measure with the appurtenances situate lying and being in the
 said Township of Lanseynoe Parish of Cadoxton and County of Hereford within the
 Fee of the Manor and then in the possession of the said John Price out of Court
 Surrendered the said two Acres of Customary Lands Welsh Measure with the
 Appurtenances into the Hands of the said Lord of the said Manor by the Assent
 of his Steward to the Intent that the said Lord might if he pleased by his Steward

 During the Respective Lives of the said James his Brother now aged about Twenty one
 years and the said William Price now aged about Eighteen years and the Life of the
 longest Liver of them by Copy of Court Roll at the Will of the said Lord according to the
 Custom of the said Manor Yielding and paying therefor yearly and every year during
 the said Term unto the said Lord Abergaenny his Heirs and assigns the Rent of one
 six pence of lawful money of Great Britain at the feast Day of Saint Michael the
 Arch Angel only and the sum of Ten shillings of like lawful money for and in the
 Name of an Herriott at the Feast of the Ascension or Surrender of every Tenant of the said
 Premises or any part thereof And Doing Suit of Court and other Customs and Services
 which the Rest of the Customary Tenants of the said Manor Do or Ought of right to
 do and perform And the said William Price hath to fore paid as an herriott on
 the Surrender for his Estate the sum of Ten shillings and thereupon has admitted
 To hold of the said Premises and hath sworn by the Oath but his fealty is
 Respited untill and so forth.
