Manor of Ewyas Lacy in the parish of the Right Honorable George Lord and Baron of the part of the Right Honorable George Lord Abingdon in the County of Hereford at the Castle of Longton on the said Monday the eighth day of July in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty five before

Whereas Benjamin Wellington of the parish of Saint Martin in the fields within the Liberty of Westminster Gentleman one of the Customary Tenants of this Manor hold of the Lord of the Manor aforesaid All that Messuage or Tenement and Buildings together with Twenty five Acres of Customary Land Welsh Measure with their Appurtenances (That is to say) One Hundred Acres of Winchester Measure situate lying and being in Newton within the fee of this Manor in the possession of William Edwards and which were granted to him his heirs and assigns by Letters Patent bearing Date the fifth month Day of November last for and during the respective Lives of James Pool of Stratton Grandson in the County of Hereford Esq; then aged about twenty three years Edward Foley son of Thomas Foley of Stoke Lath in the said County of Hereford Esq; then aged about fifteen years and Josiah Lyles Heathcote son of George Heathcote of the City of Hereford Esquire then aged about sixteen years and the life of the longest Liver of them according to the custom of the said Manor And at this Court came Thomas Church Gentleman and Robert Shaw two of the Customary Tenants of the said Manor and brought into Court a certain writing bearing Date the fifth Day of February One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty five purporting a Surrender which the said Benjamin Wellington by Henry Jones Gentleman his Attorney by virtue of a Letter of Attorney under the Hand and Seal of the said Benjamin Wellington bearing Date the seventh Day of December One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty five had according to the Custom of the said Manor out of Court surrendered into the hands of the said Lord in the presence of the said Thomas Church and Robert Shaw to the intent that the said Thomas Church and Robert Shaw might carry the said Surrender into Court and Testify upon Oath the Execution thereof which accordingly they did at this Court and by which said Surrender it appears that the said Benjamin Wellington by the said Henry Jones his Attorney aforesaid Surrendered All the said Messuage or Tenement and Buildings together with the said Twenty five Acres of Customary Land Welsh Measure together with the Appurtenances (That is to say) One Hundred Acres of Winchester Measure about mentioned according to the Custom of the said Manor To the Use of Thomas Parry of the parish of Lambeth in the County of Surrey Esquire and his heirs and assigns for and during the respective Lives aforesaid and the life of the longest Liver of them And also Afterwards at this Court came the said Thomas Parry by Henry Marsh of Newton Gentleman his Attorney and prayed to be Admitted Tenant of the said Messuage or Tenement

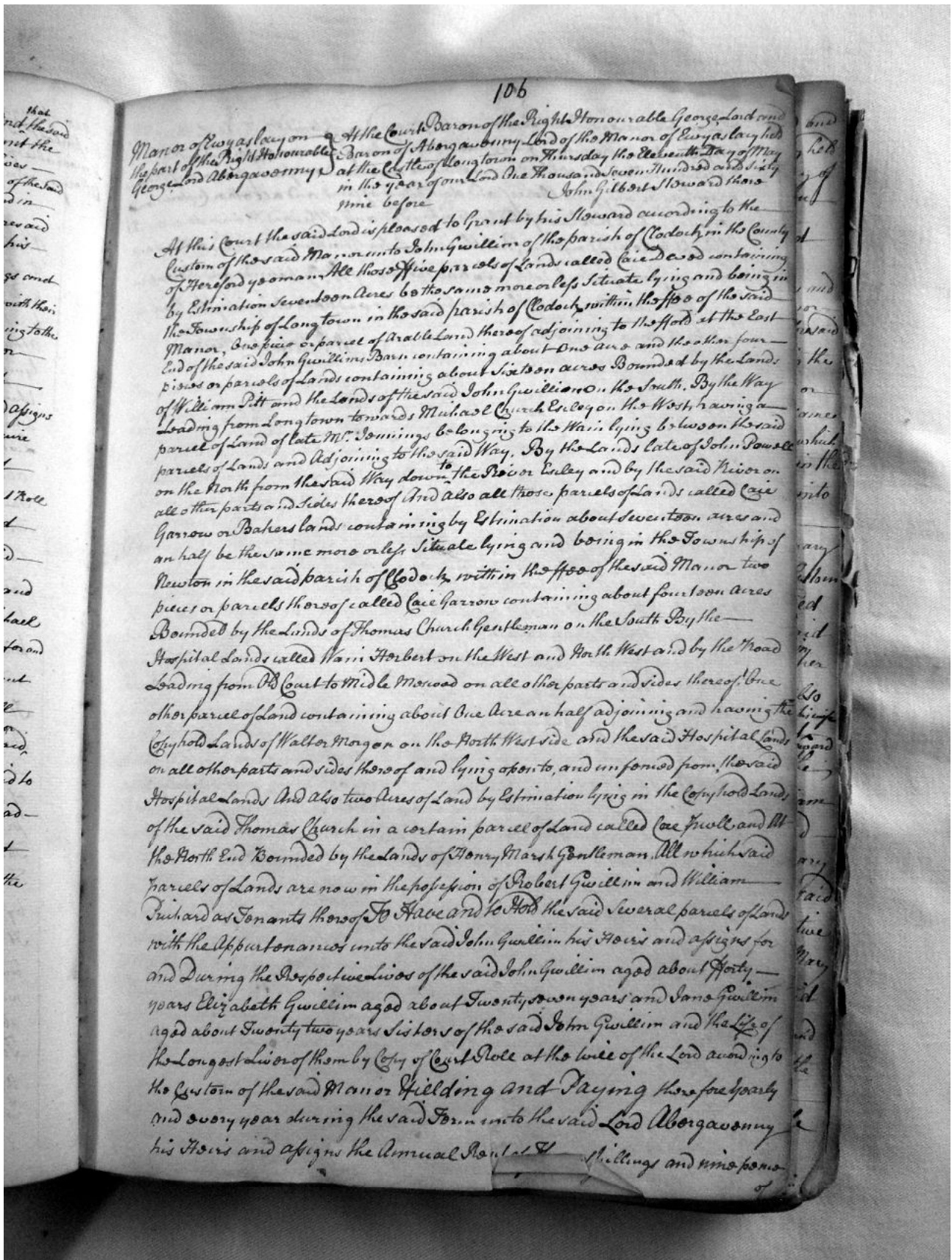

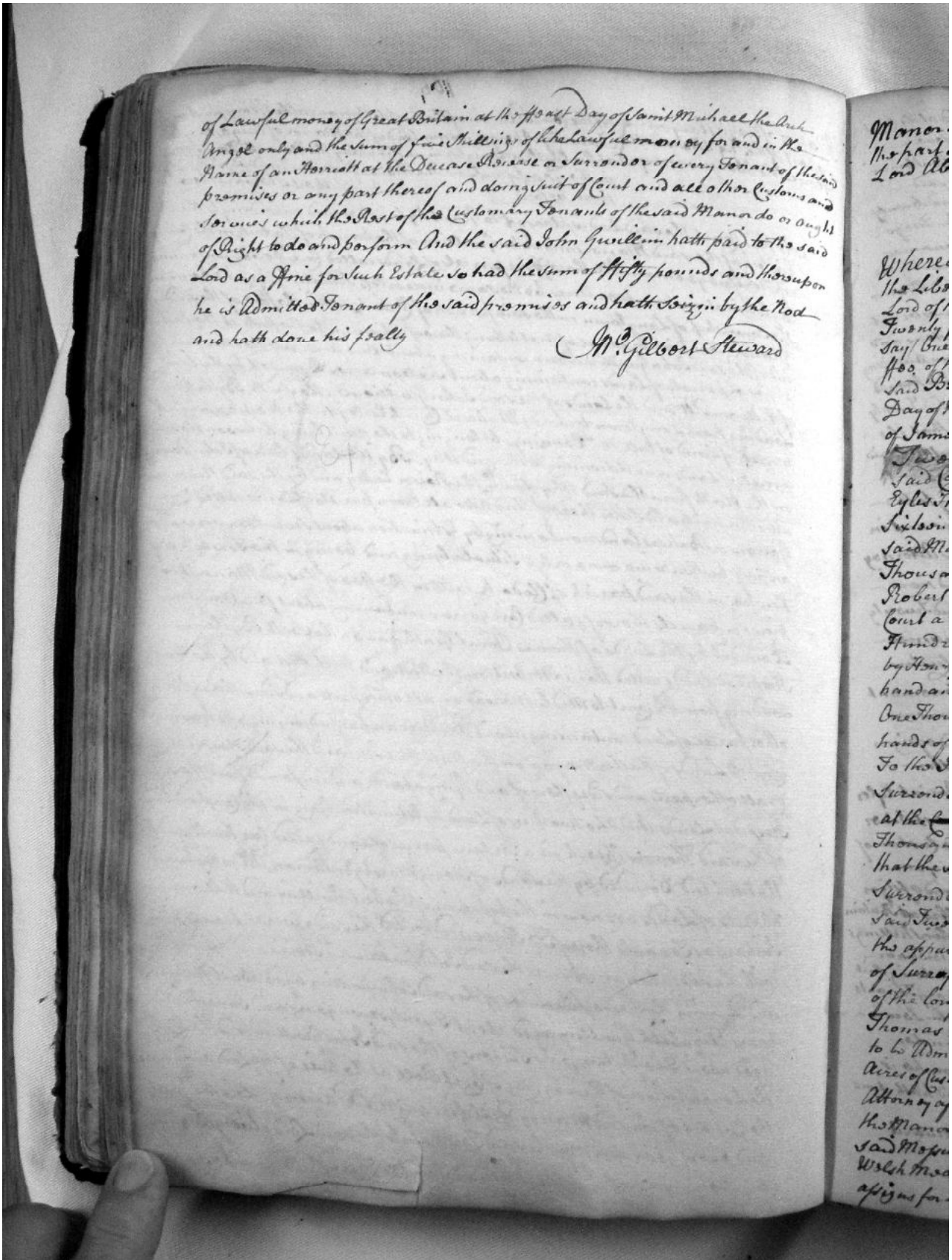
