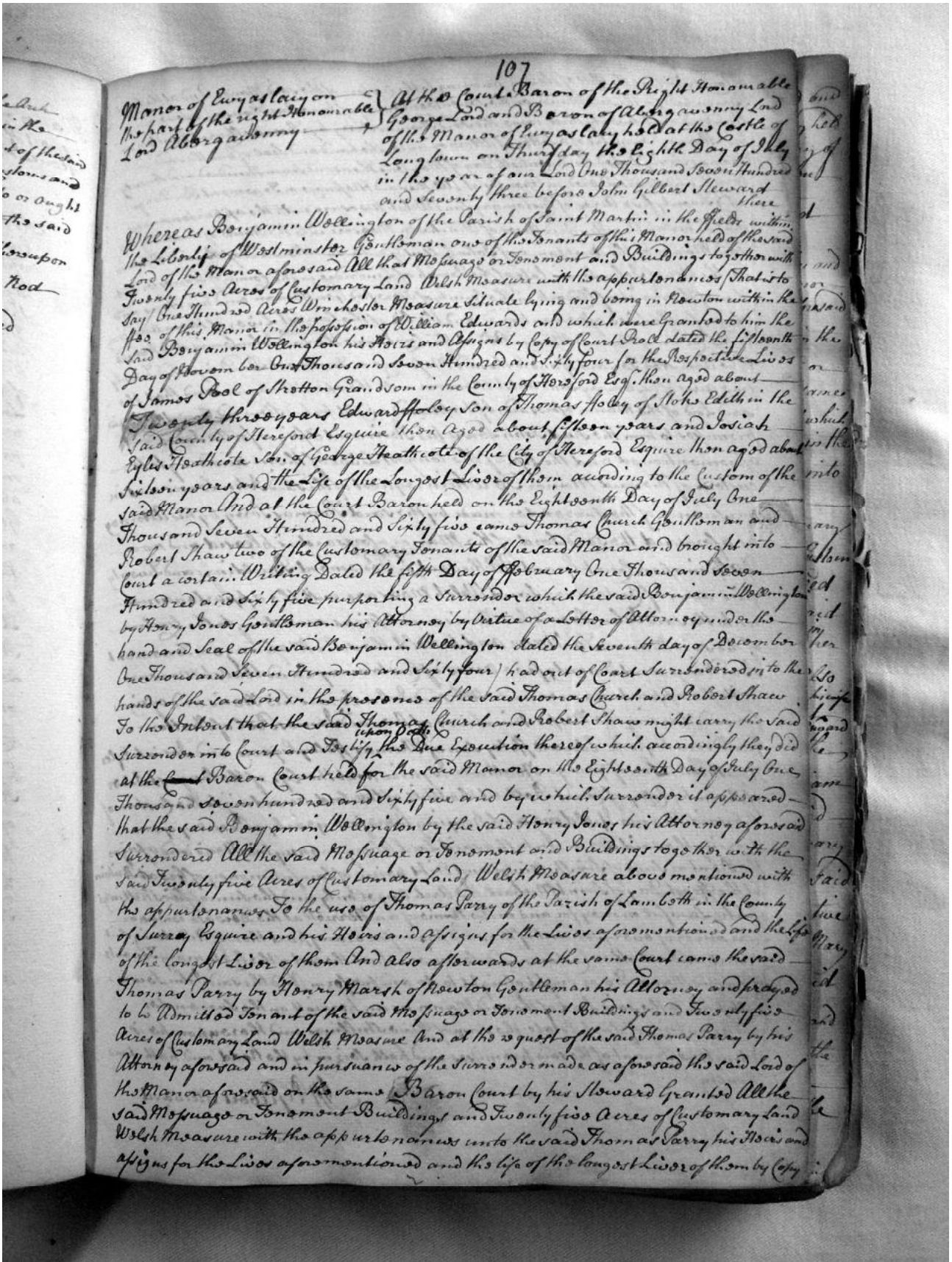

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Manor of Ewyas Lacy on the part of the right Honourable Lord Abbot of Ewyas Lacy

At the Court Baron of the Right Honourable George Lord and Baron of Abingdon held at the Castle of Ewyas Lacy on Thursday the Eighth Day of July in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Seventy Three before John Gilbert Steward

Whereas Benjamin Wellington of the Parish of Saint Martin in the fields within the Liberty of Westminster Gentleman one of the Tenants of this Manor held of the said Lord of the Manor aforesaid All that Mesuages or Tenement and Buildings together with Twenty five Acres of Customary Land Welsh Measure with the appurtenances that is to say One Hundred Acres Winchester Measure lying and being in Newton within the fees of this Manor in the possession of William Edwards and which were granted to him the said Benjamin Wellington his Heirs and Assigns by Copy of Court Roll dated the fifteenth Day of November One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty four for the Respective Lives of James Doal of Stratton Grandson in the County of Hereford Esq. then aged about Twenty three years Edward Hooley son of Thomas Hooley of Stoks Edith in the said County of Hereford Esquire then aged about fifteen years and Josiah Sykes Northcote son of George Northcote of the City of Hereford Esquire then aged about sixteen years and the Life of the longest Liver of them according to the Custom of the said Manor And at the Court Baron held on the eighteenth Day of July One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty five came Thomas Church Gentleman and Robert Shaw two of the Customary Tenants of the said Manor and brought into Court a certain Writing Dated the fifth Day of February One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty five purporting a Surrender which the said Benjamin Wellington by Henry Jones Gentleman his Attorney by Virtue of a Letter of Attorney signed in the hand and Seal of the said Benjamin Wellington dated the seventh day of December One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty four had out of Court Surrendered into the hands of the said Lord in the presence of the said Thomas Church and Robert Shaw To the Intent that the said Thomas Church and Robert Shaw might carry the said Surrender into Court and to this due Execution thereof which accordingly they did at the Court Baron held for the said Manor on the eighteenth Day of July One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty five and by which Surrender it appeared that the said Benjamin Wellington by the said Henry Jones his Attorney aforesaid Surrendered All the said Mesuages or Tenement and Buildings together with the said Twenty five Acres of Customary Land Welsh Measure about mentioned with the appurtenances To the use of Thomas Parry of the Parish of Lambeth in the County of Surrey Esquire and his Heirs and Assigns for the Lives of aforesaid and the life of the longest Liver of them And also afterwards at the same Court came the said Thomas Parry by Henry Marsh of Newton Gentleman his Attorney and prayed to be Admitted Tenant of the said Mesuages or Tenement Buildings and Twenty five Acres of Customary Land Welsh Measure And at the request of the said Thomas Parry by his Attorney aforesaid and in pursuance of the Surrender made as aforesaid the said Lord of the Manor aforesaid on the same Baron Court by his Steward granted All the said Mesuages or Tenement Buildings and Twenty five Acres of Customary Land Welsh Measure with the appurtenances unto the said Thomas Parry his Heirs and Assigns for the Lives aforesaid and the life of the longest Liver of them by Copy



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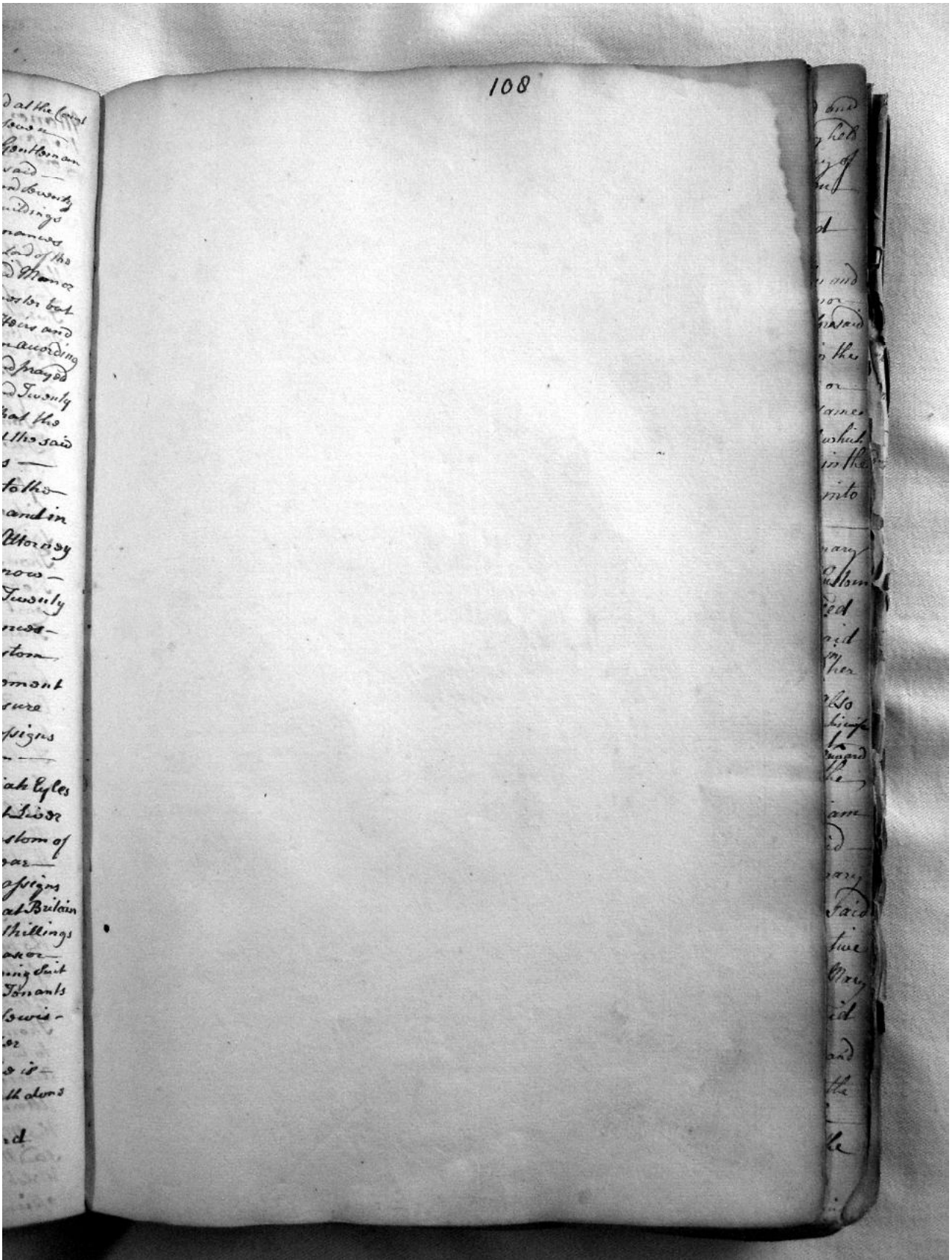
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of Court Roll at the Will of the Lord according to the Custom of the said Manor And at the Court Baron held for the said Manor on the Twentieth Day of June One Thousand and Six hundred and twenty three came the said Thomas Barry by Thomas Churchyngton and his Attorney by virtue of a Letter of Attorney under the hand and seal of him the said Thomas Barry Dated the Twentieth Day of May One Thousand seven hundred and twenty three) and surrendered in Open Court All the said Messuages or Tenement Buildings and Twenty five Acres of Customary Land Welsh Measure with the appurtenances that is to say One Hundred Acres of Winchester Measure into the Hands of the Lord of the said Manor by the Acceptance of John Gilbert Gentleman Steward of the said Manor For the Use of John Lewis late of the Parish of Lindridge in the County of Worcester but then of the Parish of Llanoch in the County of Hereford Gentleman and his Heirs and Assigns for the Lives of the said and the Life of the longest Liver of them according to the Custom of the said Manor And at this Court came the said John Lewis and prayed to be admitted Tenant of and to the said Messuages or Tenement Buildings and Twenty five Acres of Customary Land Welsh Measure with the appurtenances And that the said Lord of the Manor aforesaid, if he pleased might by his Shew and Grant the said premises to him the said John Lewis his Heirs and Assigns for the Lives of the said and the Life of the longest Liver of them according to the Custom of the said Manor To which request of the said John Lewis and in pursuance of the Surrender made by the said Thomas Barry by his Attorney as aforesaid the said Lord of the Manor aforesaid is pleased and now doth in open Court Grant All the said ^{Messuages} or Tenement Buildings and Twenty five Acres of Customary Land Welsh Measure with the appurtenances unto the said John Lewis his Heirs and Assigns according to the Custom of the said Manor To Have and to hold the said Messuages or Tenement Buildings and Twenty five Acres of Customary Land Welsh Measure with the appurtenances unto the said John Lewis his Heirs and Assigns for and during the respective Lives of the said James Pool of Stratton Grandson Esquire Edward Foley son of Thomas Foley Esquire and Josiah Eyles Heathcote Son of George Heathcote Esquire and the Life of the longest Liver of them by Copy of Court Roll at the Will of the Lord according to the Custom of the said Manor Yielding and paying therefor yearly and every year the Rent or Sum of Six Shillings and Eight pence of lawful money of Great Britain at the Feast Day of Saint Michael the Arch Angel only and the Sum of five Shillings of like Lawful money for and in the Name of an Horriell at the Days 25 25 25 or Surrender of every Tenant of the said premises or any part thereof And doing dut of Court and all other Customs and Services which the rest of the Customary Tenants of the said Manor do or ought of right to do and perform And the said John Lewis hath paid to the said Lord of the said Manor as an horriell on the Surrender and Granting of such Estate the Sum of Five Shillings and thereupon he is admitted Tenant of the said premises and hath seizin by the Rodd and hath done finally

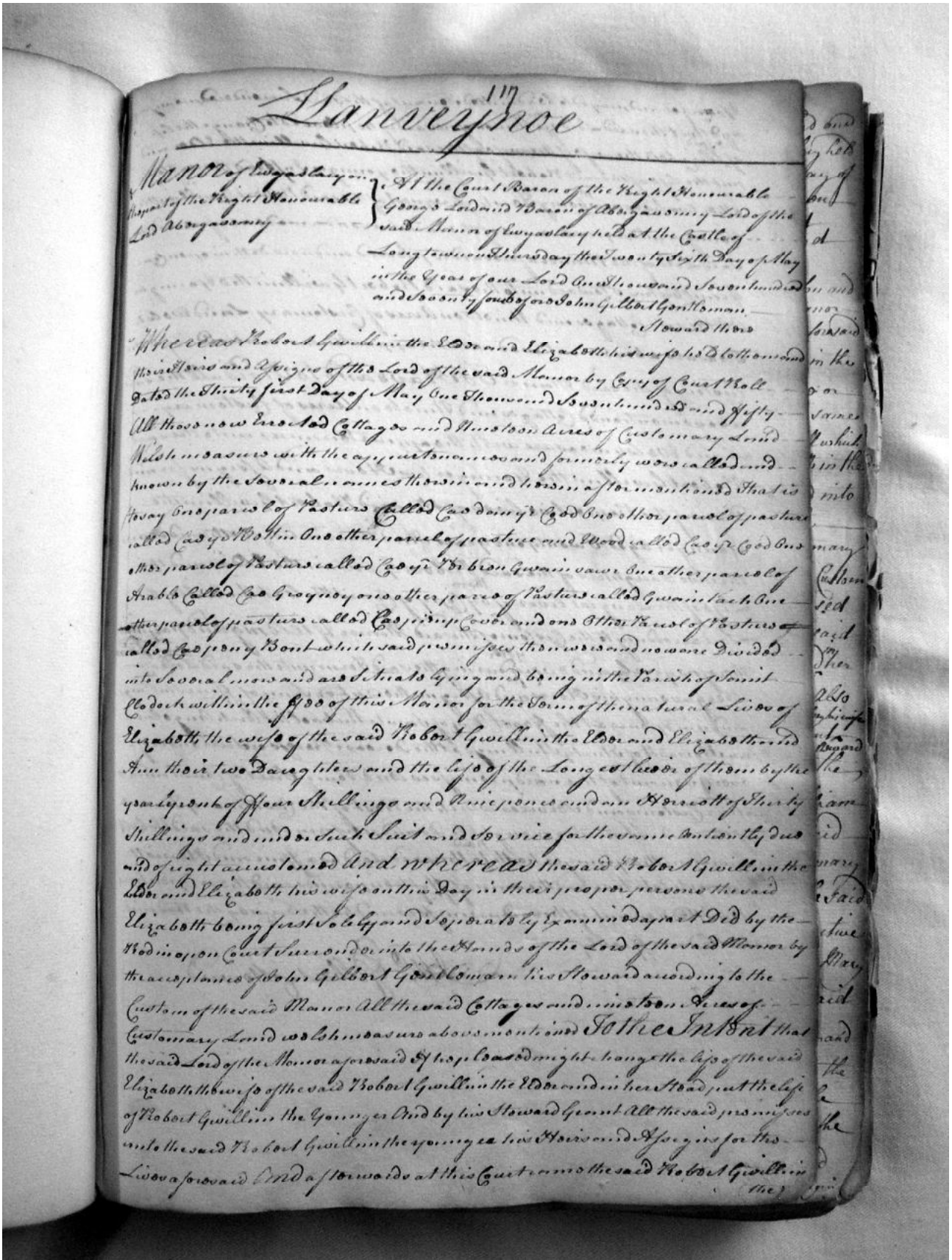
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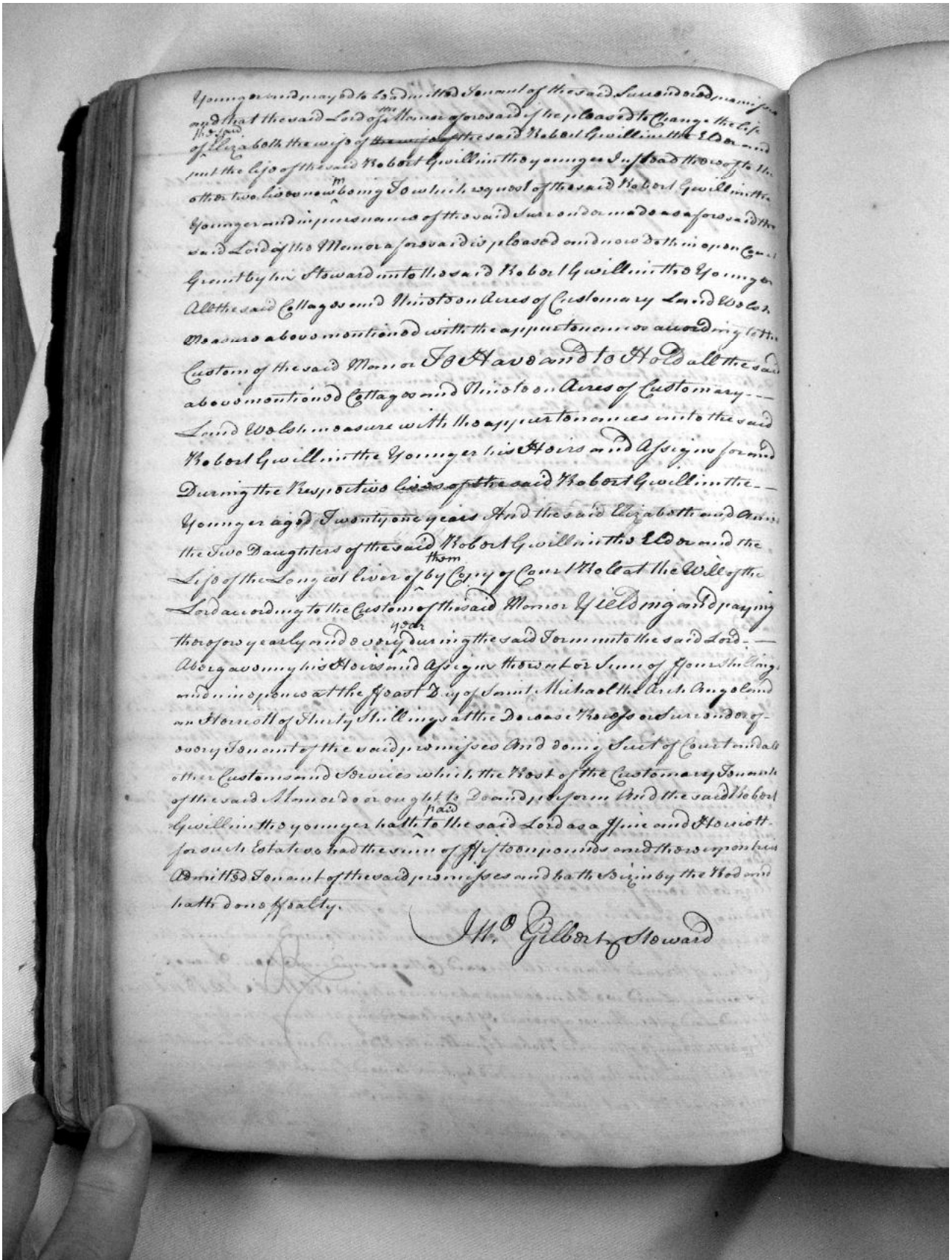
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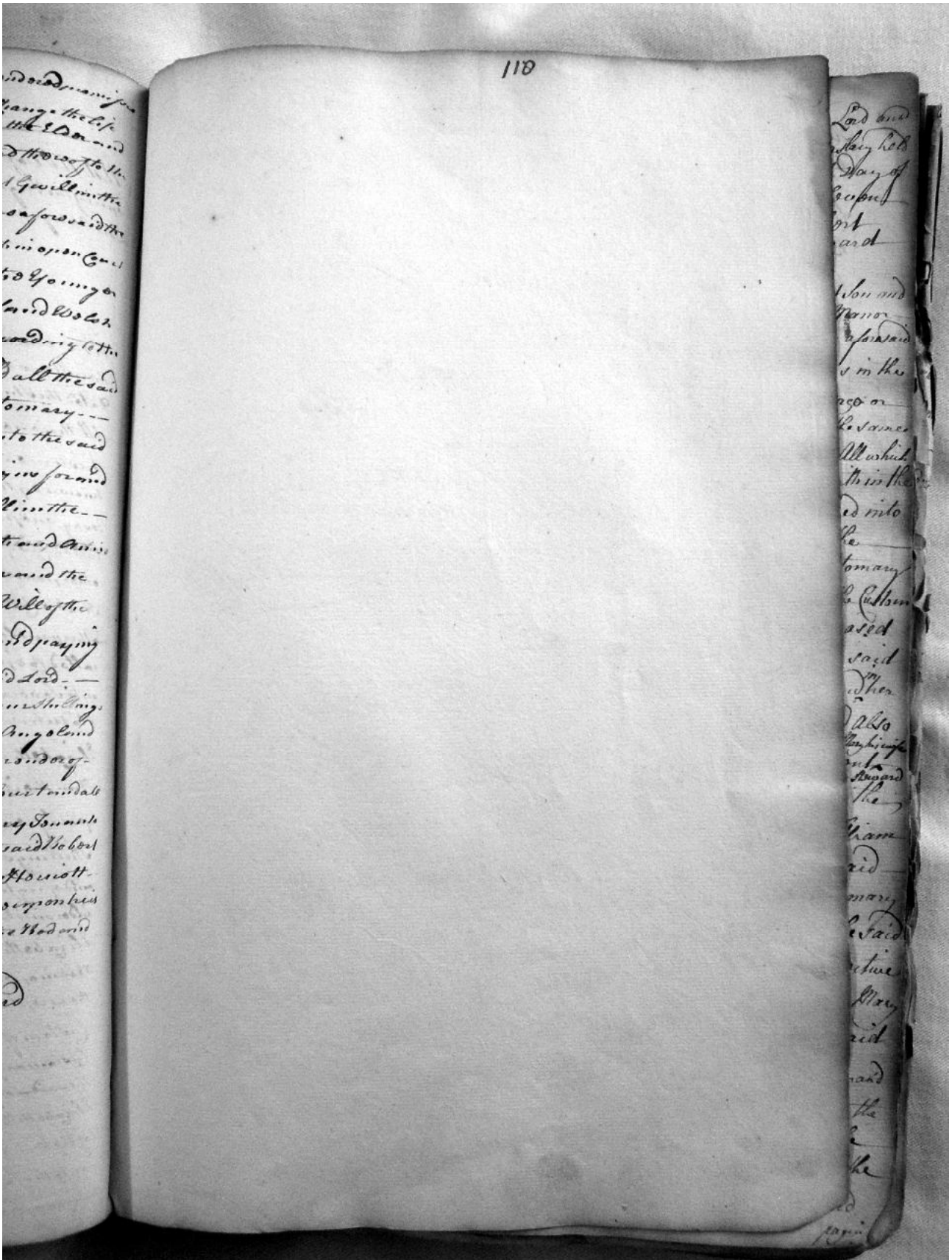

 above named his heirs and assigns the sum of four shillings
 and six pence at the Feast Day of Saint Michael the Arch Angel and
 an Hour of Shrove Tuesday at the Decore the said Lord and his
 every Tenant of the said premises And doing Suit of Court and all
 other Customs and Services which the best of the Customary Tenants
 of the said Manor are ought to do and perform And the said Robert
 Gwillim the younger hath to the said Lord as a fine and Hour of
 for such Estate had the sum of fifty pounds and thereupon he
 admitted Tenant of the said premises and hath sworn by the God and
 hath done fealty.

At the Court Baron of the right Honorable George Lord and
 Baron of Hereford my Lord of the Manor of Ewyas Lacy held
 at the Castle of Hereford on Thursday the Eleventh Day of
 August in the year of our Lord God 1700 and 20 years
 Hundred and fifty seven before M^r Gilbert
 Steward

At this Court came William Jones in his proper person eldest son and
 heir of John Jones deceased one of the customary tenants of this Manor
 who held to him and his heirs and assigns of the Lord of the Manor of several
 by Copy of Court Roll Dated the Twelfth Day of May which was in the
 year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and fifteen one Cottage or
 Tenement, one Garden and two Acres of Land with Measure to the same
 more or less with the appurtenances for the Term of One Life, all which
 said premises are situate lying and being in Lower Mead within the
 Fee of this Manor, and hath in Court by the Trade Surrendered into
 the hands of the said Lord by the Acquiescence of his Heirs and the
 aforesaid Cottage or Tenement Garden and two Acres of Customary
 Land with Measure with their appurtenances according to the Custom
 of the said Manor So the intent that the said Lord if he pleased
 might by his Steward take out the Life of Joanna Sister of the said
 William Jones the only Life now in the above recited Copy and then
 place and read put the Life of the said William Jones and also
 add two new acres and one or two of the said Cottage or Tenement
 Garden and two Acres of Customary Land with Measure to the
 same more or less with their appurtenances unto the said William
 Jones and Mary his wife So have and to hold the said
 Cottage or Tenement with the Garden and two Acres of Customary
 Land with Measure with their appurtenances unto the said
 William Jones and Mary his wife for and during the respective
 Lives of the said William Jones aged about thirty eight years Mary
 his wife aged about fifty five years and William son of the said
 William Jones by a former wife aged about Twelve years and for and
 after the Deaths of the said William Jones and Mary his wife to the
 Heirs and assigns of the said William Jones during the Life of the
 Longest Liver of them by Copy of Court Roll at the will of the
 Lord according to the Custom of the said Manor

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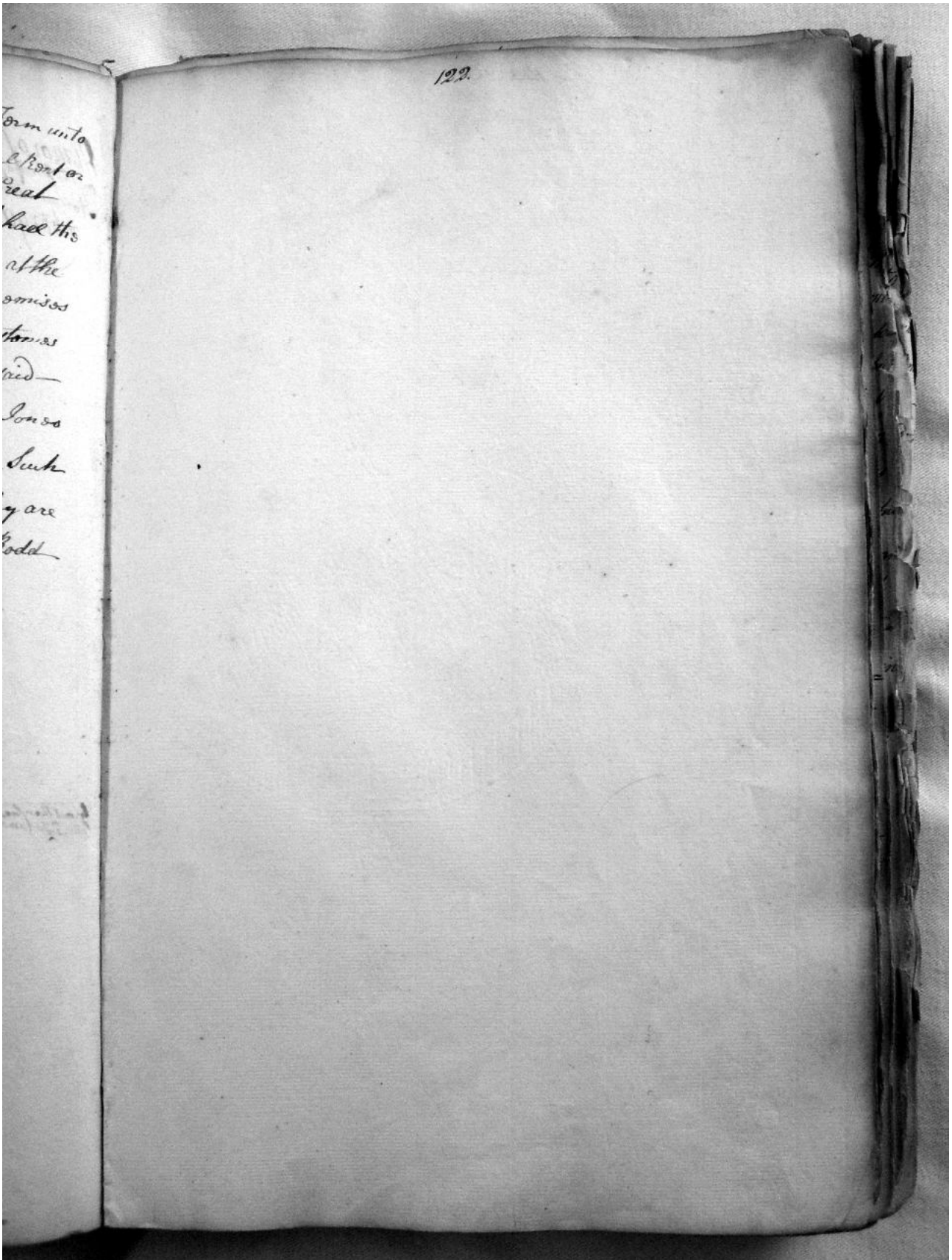
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Paying there yearly and every year during the said Term unto

 Sum of six Shillings and eight Pence of lawful money of Great

 Arch Angel and an Annott of two Shillings and six pence at the
 Decore Rescap or Surrender of every Tenant of the said premises
 or any part thereof And doing Suit of Court and all other Customs
 and Services which the most of the Customary Tenants of the said
 Manor do or ought to do and perform And the said William Jones
 and Mary his wife have given to the said Lord as a fine for such
 Estate so had the Sum of seven teen pounds and thereupon they are
 Admitted Tenants of the said premises and had Seizin by the Rodde
 and did to the Lord Fealty

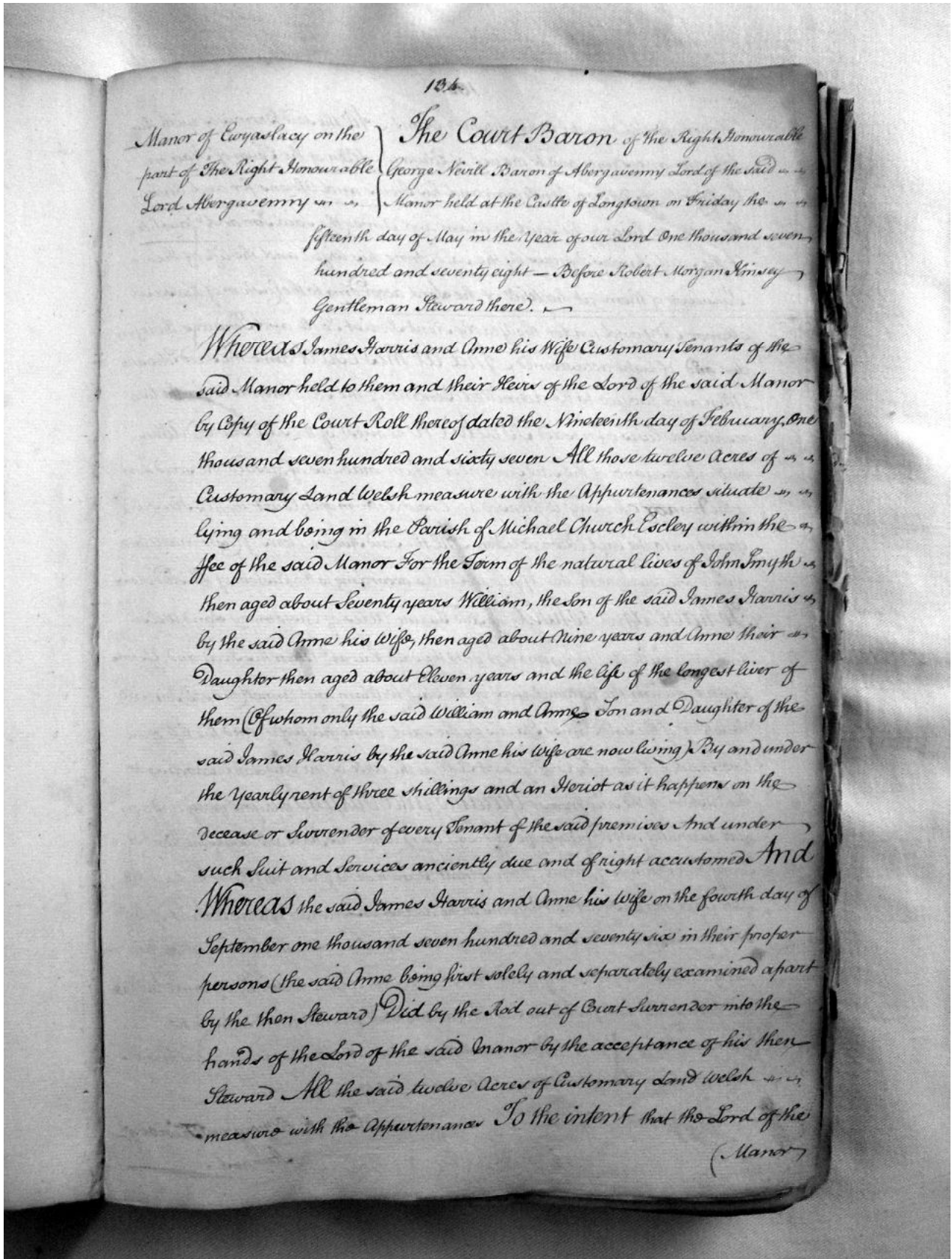
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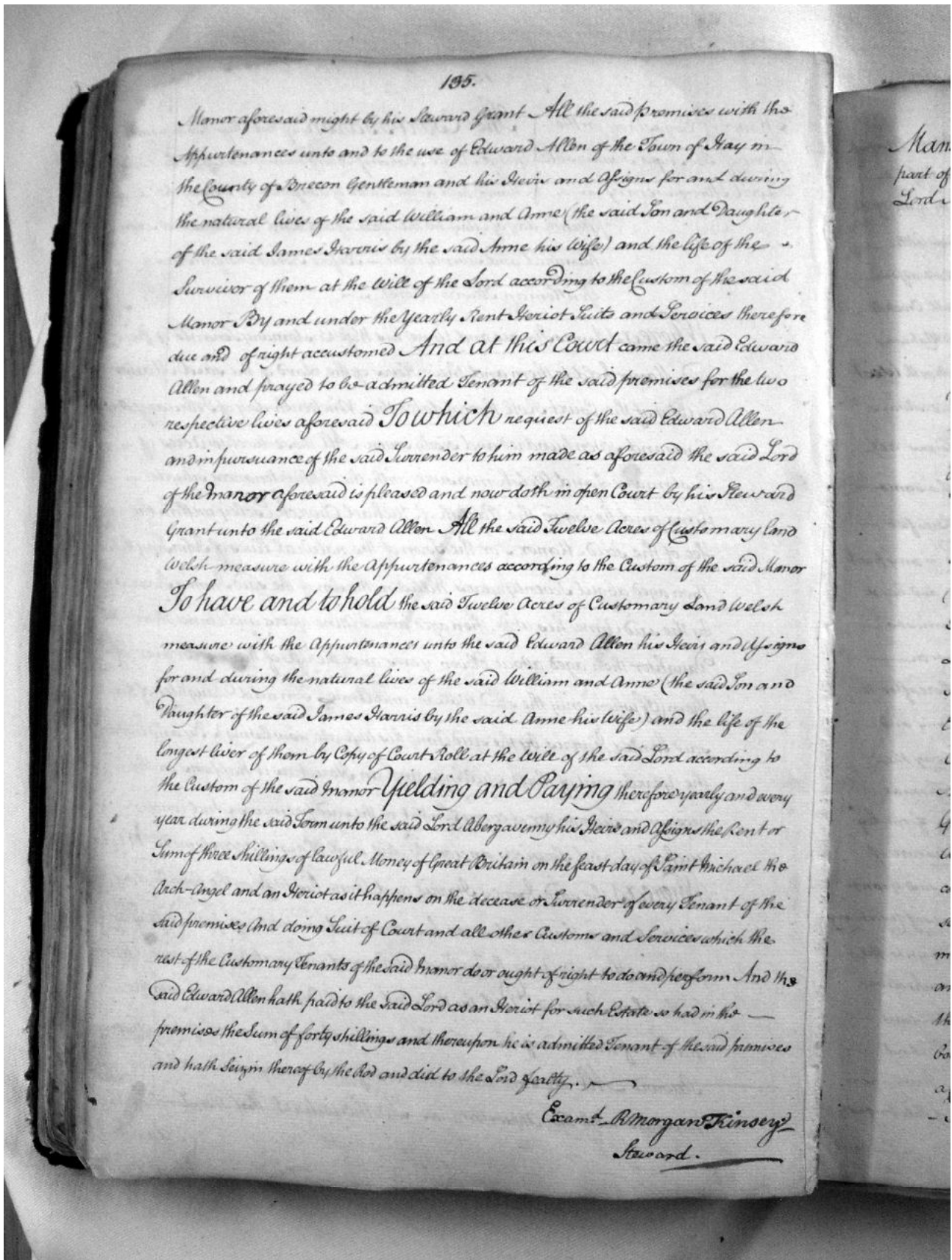
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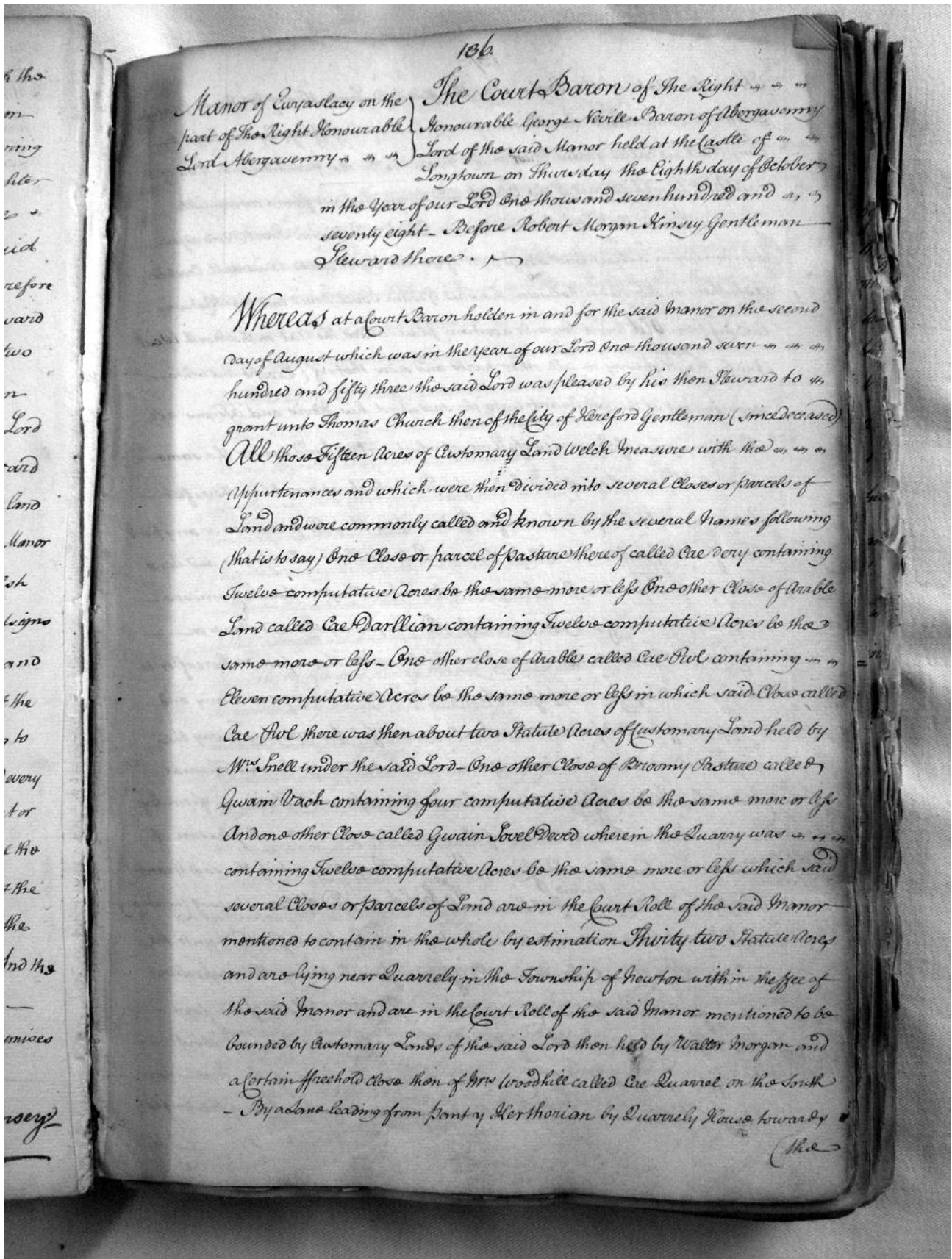

All the said Twelve Acres of Customary Land Welsh measure with the Appurtenances according to the Custom of the said Manor To have and to hold the said Twelve Acres of Customary Land Welsh measure with the Appurtenances unto the said Edward Allen his Heirs and Assigns for and during the natural lives of the said William and Anne (the said Son and Daughter of the said James Davaris by the said Anne his wife) and the life of the longest liver of them by Copy of Court Roll at the Will of the said Lord according to the Custom of the said Manor Yielding and Paying therefore yearly and every year during the said Term unto the said Lord Albergavenny his Heirs and Assigns the Rent or Sum of three shillings of lawful Money of Great Britain on the feast day of Saint Michael the Arch-Angel and an Service as it happens on the decease or Surrender of every Tenant of the said premises (And doing Suit of Court and all other Customs and Services which the rest of the Customary Tenants of the said Manor do or ought of right to do and perform. And the said Edward Allen hath paid to the said Lord as an Service for such Estate as had in the premises the Sum of forty shillings and thereupon he is admitted Tenant of the said premises and hath Seizin thereof by the God and did to the Lord fealty.
