**Manor of Ewyas Lacy** The Special Customary Court of The Right  
 in the part of The Honorable Henry Earl of Abergavenny Knight  
 Right Honorable of the most ancient order of the Thistle Lord of

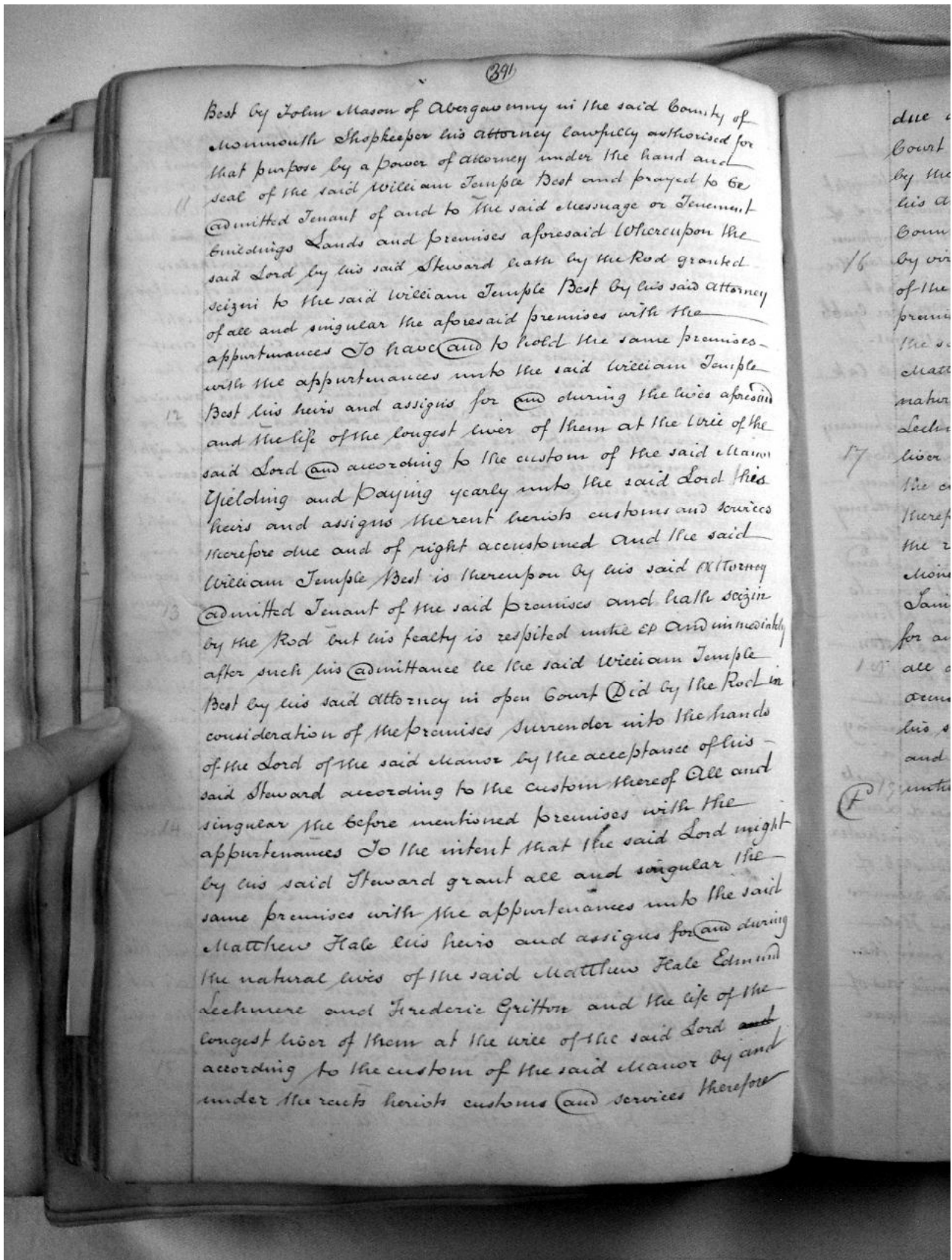

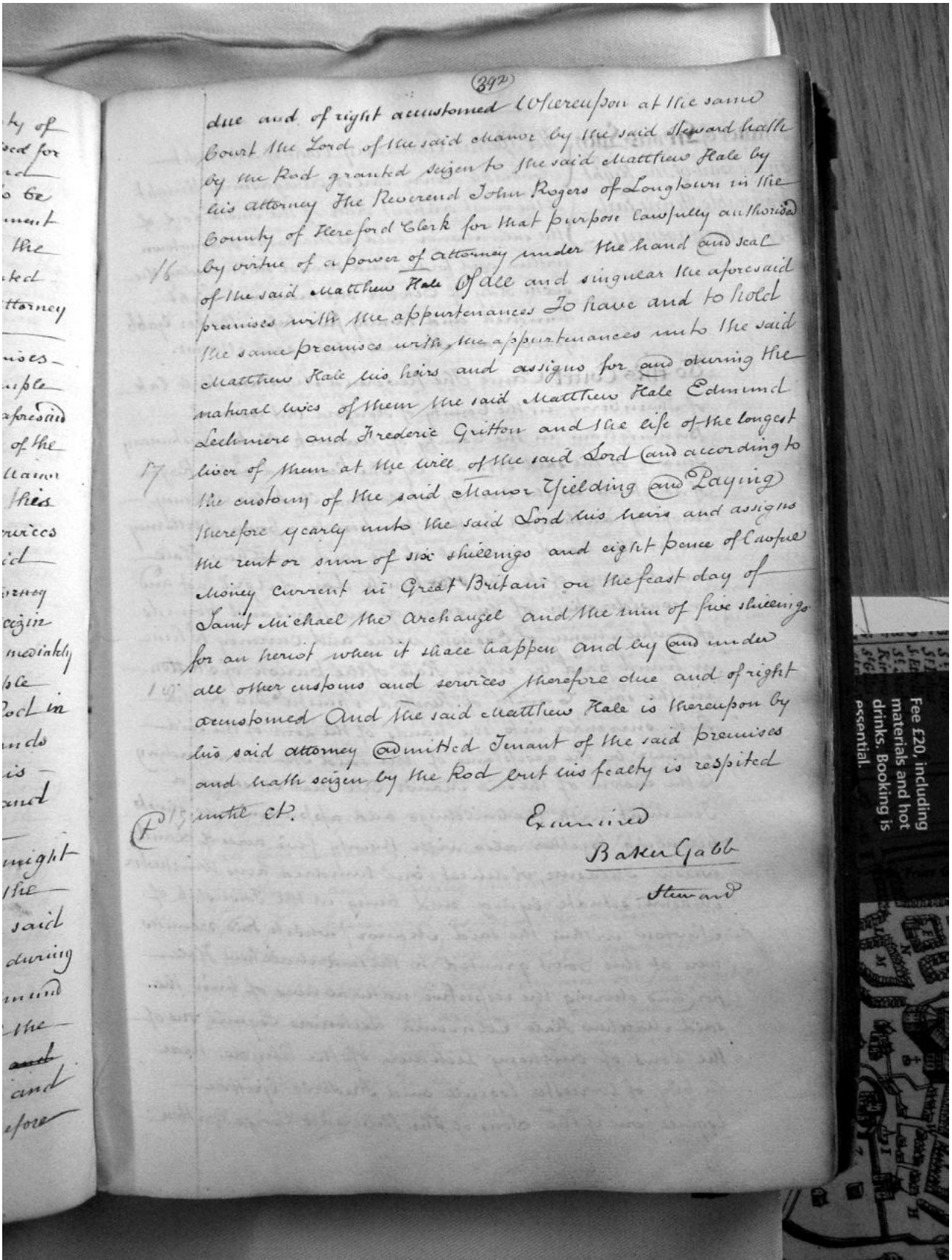
