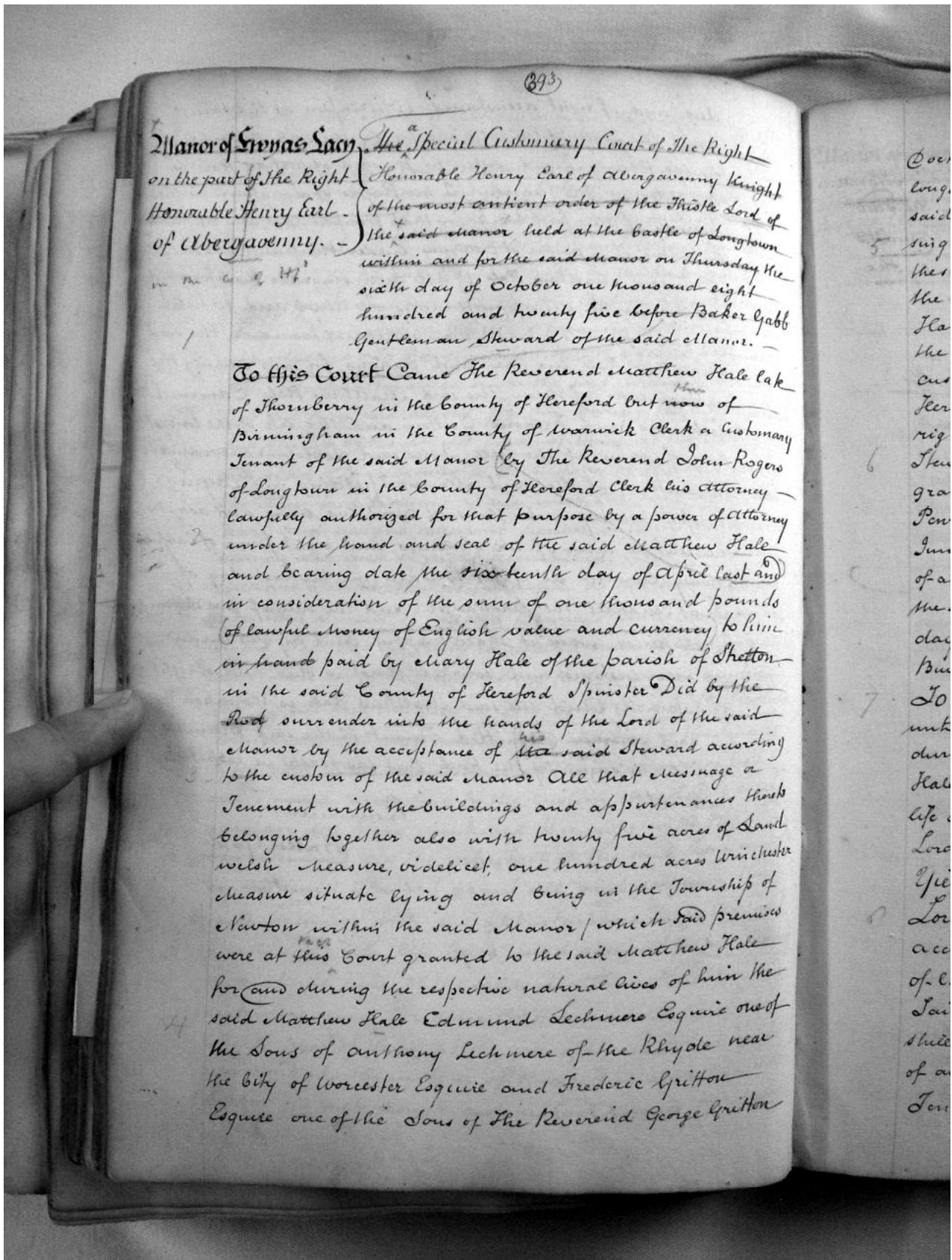

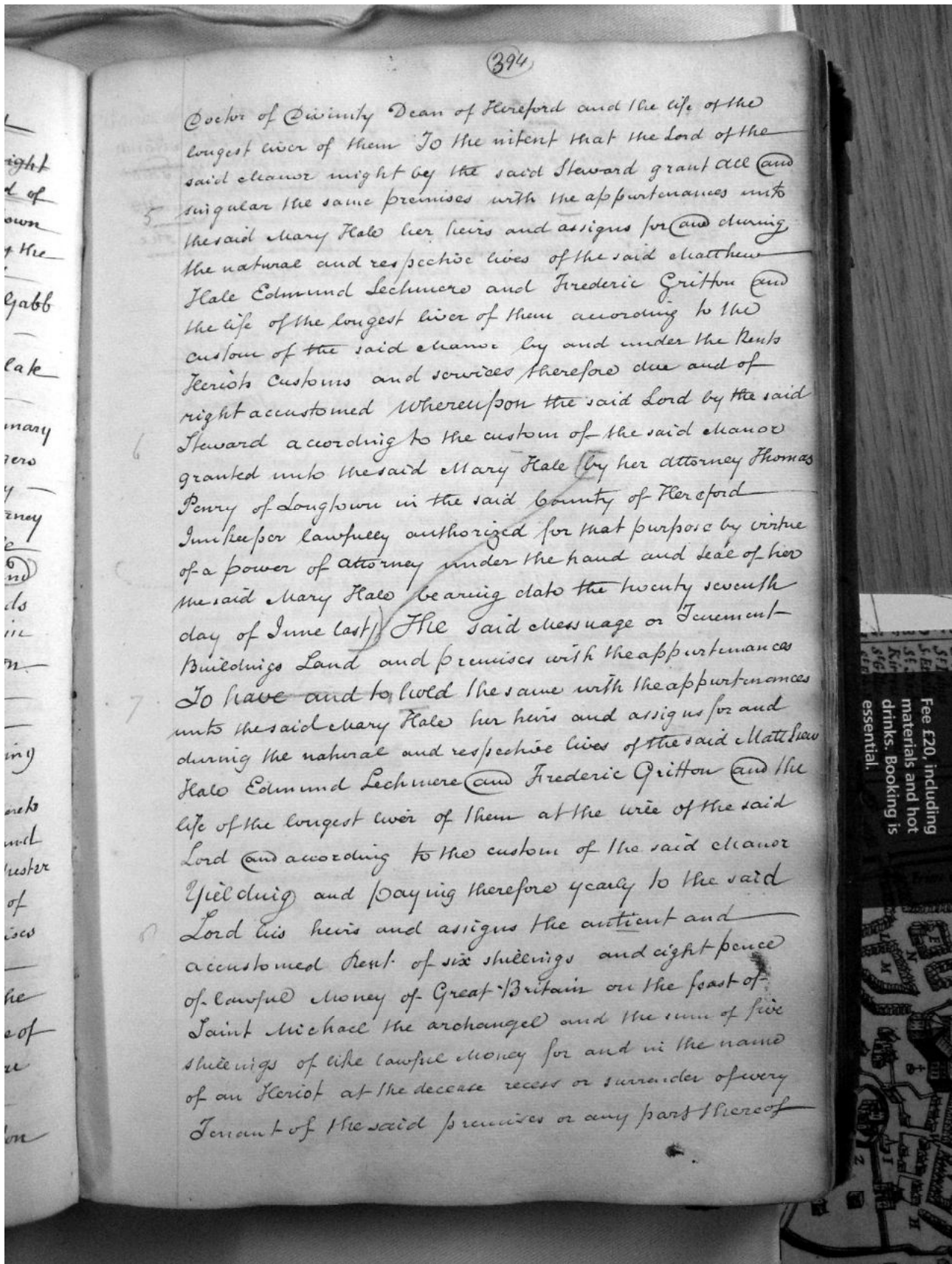
Manor of Ewyas Lacy. The Special Customary Court of the Right
 on the part of the Right Honourable Henry Earl of Abergavenny Knight
 of the most ancient order of the Thistle Lord of
 of Abergavenny. } the said manor held at the castle of Longtown
 within and for the said manor on Thursday the
 sixth day of October one thousand eight
 hundred and twenty five before Baker Gabb
 Gentleman Steward of the said manor.

To this Court Came The Reverend Matthew Hale late
 of Thornberry in the County of Hereford but now of
 Birmingham in the County of Warwick Clerk a Customary
 Tenant of the said manor by The Reverend John Rogers
 of Longtown in the County of Hereford Clerk his attorney
 lawfully authorized for that purpose by a power of attorney
 under the hand and seal of the said Matthew Hale
 and bearing date the sixteenth day of April last and
 in consideration of the sum of one thousand pounds
 of lawful money of English value and currency to him
 in hand paid by Mary Hale of the parish of Stetton
 in the said County of Hereford Spinster Did by the
 Deed surrender into the hands of the Lord of the said
 manor by the acceptance of the said Steward according
 to the custom of the said manor All that messuage a
 Tenement with the buildings and appurtenances thereto
 belonging together also with twenty five acres of Land
 welsh measure, videlicet, one hundred acres Welsh
 measure situate lying and being in the Township of
 Stetton within the said manor which said premises
 were at this Court granted to the said Matthew Hale
 for and during the respective natural lives of him the
 said Matthew Hale Edmund Lechmere Esquire one of
 the Sons of Anthony Lechmere of the Rhayole near
 the City of Worcester Esquire and Frederic Britton
 Esquire one of the Sons of The Reverend George Britton



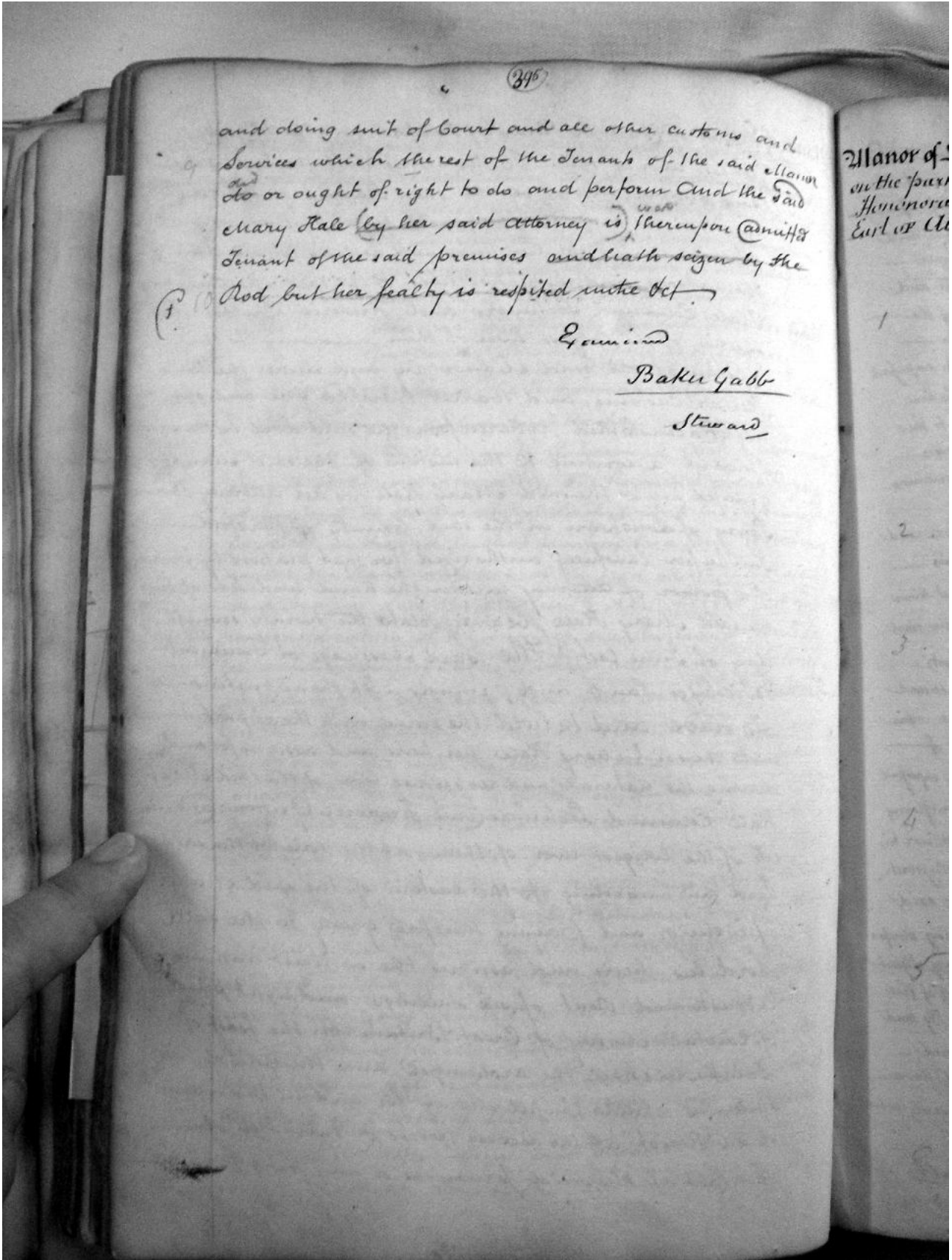

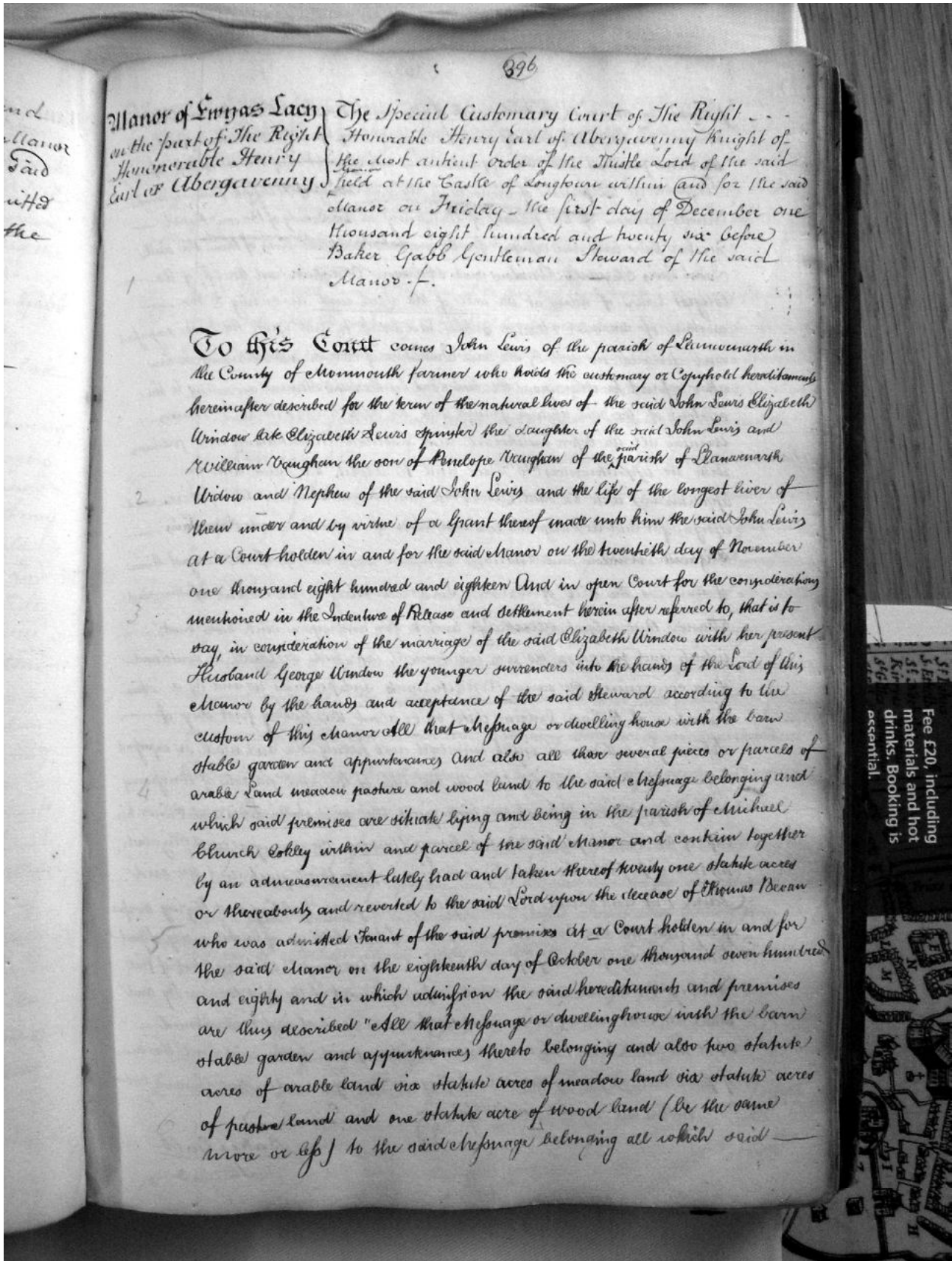

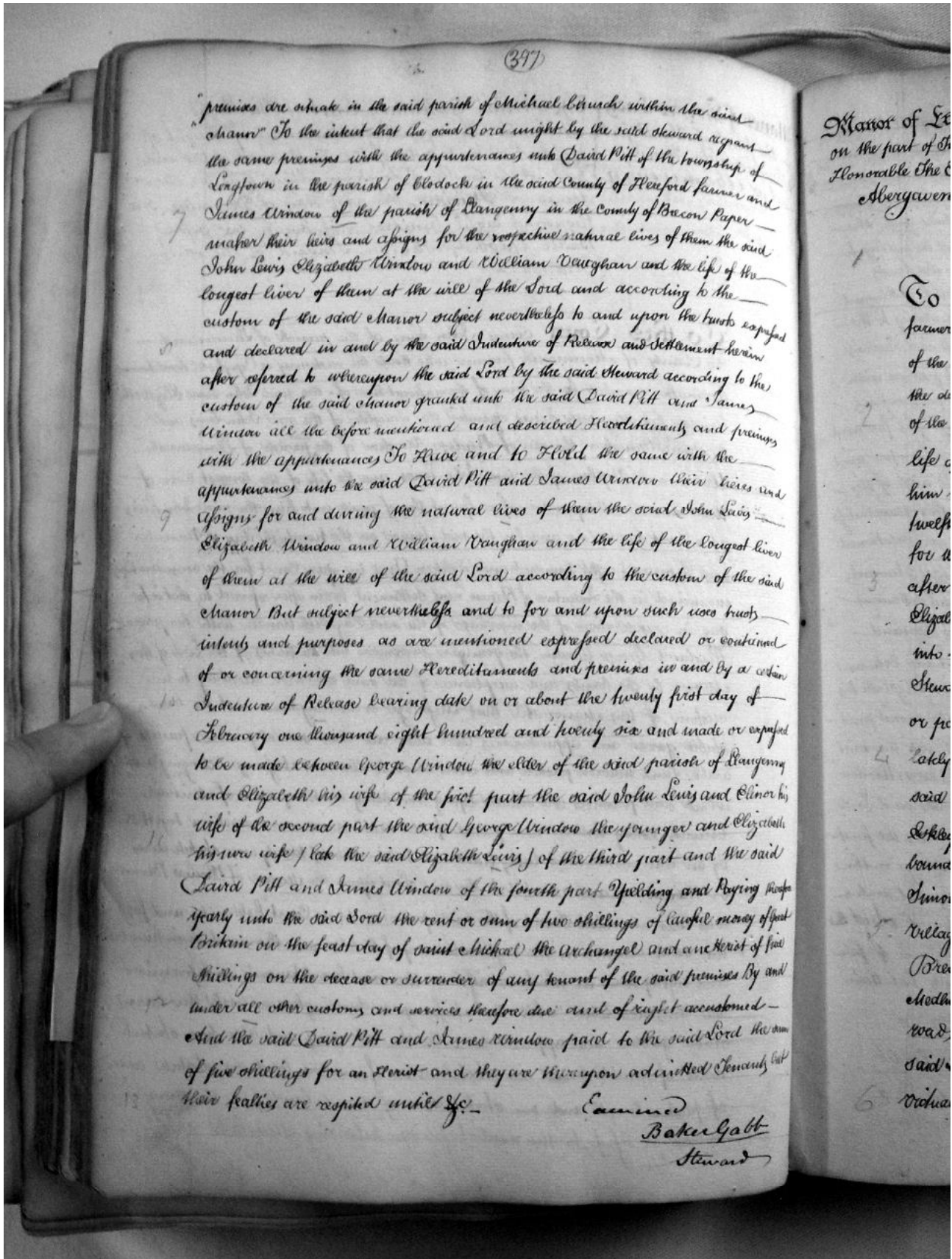
Manor of Ewyas Lacy } The Special Customary Court of The Right
 on the part of The Right } Honorable Henry Earl of Abergevenny Knight of
 Honorable Henry } the most ancient Order of the Trustle Lord of the said
 Earl of Abergevenny } held at the Castle of Longtown within and for the said
 Manor on Friday the first day of December one
 thousand eight hundred and twenty six before
 Baker Esq. Gentleman Steward of the said
 Manor.

To this Court comes John Lewis of the parish of Llannawarth in
 the County of Monmouth farmer who holds the customary or Copyhold hereditaments
 hereinafter described for the term of the natural lives of the said John Lewis Elizabeth
 Window like Elizabeth Lewis spinster the daughter of the said John Lewis and
 William Vaughan the son of Penelope Vaughan of the parish of Llannawarth
 Widow and Nephew of the said John Lewis and the life of the longest liver of
 them under and by virtue of a Grant thereof made unto him the said John Lewis
 at a Court holden in and for the said Manor on the twentieth day of November
 one thousand eight hundred and eighteen And in open Court for the consideration
 mentioned in the Indenture of Release and Settlement herein after referred to, that is to
 say, in consideration of the marriage of the said Elizabeth Window with her present
 Husband George Window the younger surrenders into the hands of the Lord of this
 Manor by the hands and acceptance of the said Steward according to the
 custom of this Manor all that Mesuage or dwelling house with the barn
 stable garden and appurtenances And also all those several pieces or parcels of
 arable Land meadow pasture and wood land to the said Mesuage belonging and
 which said premises are situate lying and being in the parish of Michael
 Blunch Colley within and parcel of the said Manor and contain together
 by an admeasurement lately had and taken thereof twenty one statute acres
 or thereabouts and reverted to the said Lord upon the decease of Thomas Deean
 who was admitted Tenant of the said premises at a Court holden in and for
 the said Manor on the eighteenth day of October one thousand seven hundred
 and eighty and in which admission the said hereditaments and premises
 are thus described "all that Mesuage or dwelling house with the barn
 stable garden and appurtenances thereto belonging and also two statute
 acres of arable land six statute acres of meadow land six statute acres
 of pasture land and one statute acre of wood land (be the same
 more or less) to the said Mesuage belonging all which said

premises are situate in the said parish of Michael Church within the said
 Manor To the intent that the said Lord might by the said steward against
 the same premises with the appurtenances unto David Pitt of the township of
 Longforn in the parish of Bloedock in the said County of Hereford farmer and
 James Window of the parish of Bangenny in the County of Bacon Paper
 assign their heirs and assigns for the respective natural lives of them the said
 John Lewis Elizabeth Window and William Vaughan and the life of the
 longest liver of them at the will of the Lord and according to the
 custom of the said Manor subject nevertheless to and upon the trusts expressed
 and declared in and by the said Indenture of Release and Settlement herein
 after referred to whereupon the said Lord by the said Steward according to the
 custom of the said Manor granted unto the said David Pitt and James
 Window all the before mentioned and described Hereditaments and premises
 with the appurtenances To Have and to Hold the same with the
 appurtenances unto the said David Pitt and James Window their heirs and
 assigns for and during the natural lives of them the said John Lewis
 Elizabeth Window and William Vaughan and the life of the longest liver
 of them at the will of the said Lord according to the custom of the said
 Manor But subject nevertheless and to for and upon such uses trusts
 intents and purposes as are mentioned expressed declared or contained
 of or concerning the same Hereditaments and premises in and by a certain
 Indenture of Release bearing date on or about the twenty first day of
 February one thousand eight hundred and twenty six and made or expressed
 to be made between George Window the elder of the said parish of Bangenny
 and Elizabeth his wife of the first part the said John Lewis and Eleanor his
 wife of the second part the said George Window the younger and Elizabeth
 his new wife (late the said Elizabeth Lewis) of the third part and the said
 David Pitt and James Window of the fourth part Yielding and Paying yearly
 unto the said Lord the rent or sum of five shillings of lawful money of Great
 Britain on the feast day of Saint Michael the Archangel and a Heriot of five
 shillings on the decease or surrender of any tenement of the said premises by and
 under all other customs and services therefore due and of right accustomed
 And the said David Pitt and James Window paid to the said Lord the sum
 of five shillings for an Heriot and they are thereupon admitted Tenants
 their fealties are required unto the
