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Manor of Ewyas Lacy The Special Customary Court
 on the part of The Right of The Right Honorable Henry Earl of
 Honorable Henry Earl of Albergavenny Knight of the Most ancient
 Albergavenny Order of the Garter Lord of the said

 for the said Manor on Monday the twenty seventh day
 of November One thousand eight hundred and thirty

 Nicholls Attornies then and there present.

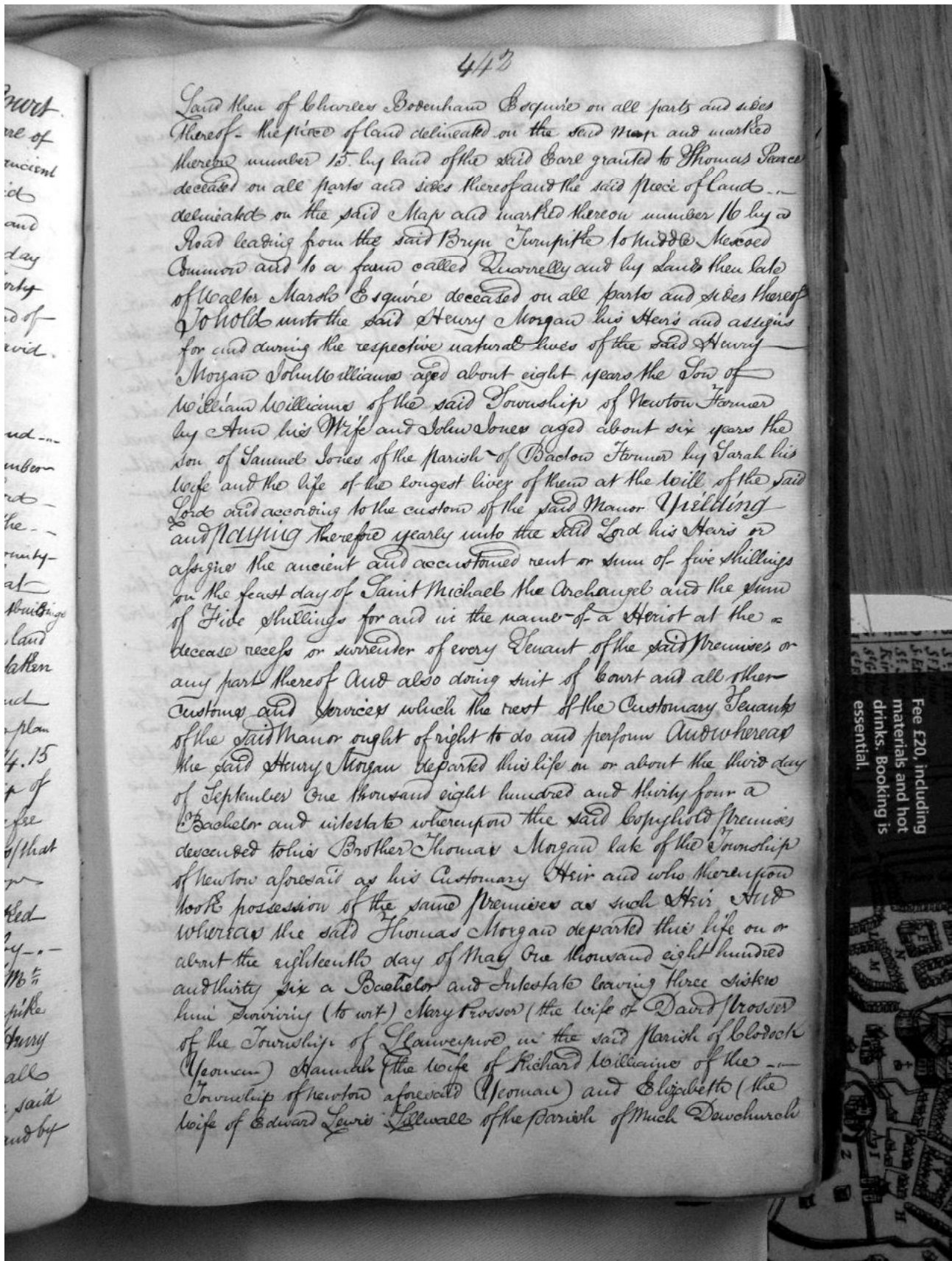
WHEREAS at a Special Customary Court holden in and
 for the said Manor on Monday the fifteenth day of September
 One thousand eight hundred and thirty three The said Lord
 Did by his said Steward grant to Henry Morgan of the
 Township of Newton within the Parish of Clodock in the County
 of Hereford Gentleman his Heirs and assigns All that
 Messuage or Tenement Stable Beauchouse Barn and Outbuildings
 and fifteen pieces or parcels of Arable Meadow and Pasture land
 containing by an admeasurements then recently had and taken
 thereof forty nine acres two roods and fourteen perches and
 which said premises are delineated on a certain Map or Plan
 and numbered thereon 3. 4. 5. 6. 7. 8. 9. 10. 11. 12. 13. 14. 15
 and 16 and are situate lying and being in the Township of
 Newton in the said Parish of Clodock and within the curse
 of the said Manor and were bounded and abutted as follows (that
 is to say) the said Messuage or Tenement and pieces or
 parcels of Land delineated on the said Map and marked
 thereon numbers 3. 4. 5. 6. 7. 8. 9. 10. 11. 12. and 13 by
 Land belonging to Trices Hospital then in the occupation of Mr
 Robert Gorrillin by a Road leading from the Bury Churchside
 to Middle Meadow Common by Lands then of the said Henry
 Morgan and by Lands then of Mary Smith widow on all
 parts and sides thereof the piece of Land delineated on the said
 Map and marked thereon number 14. by the said Road and by

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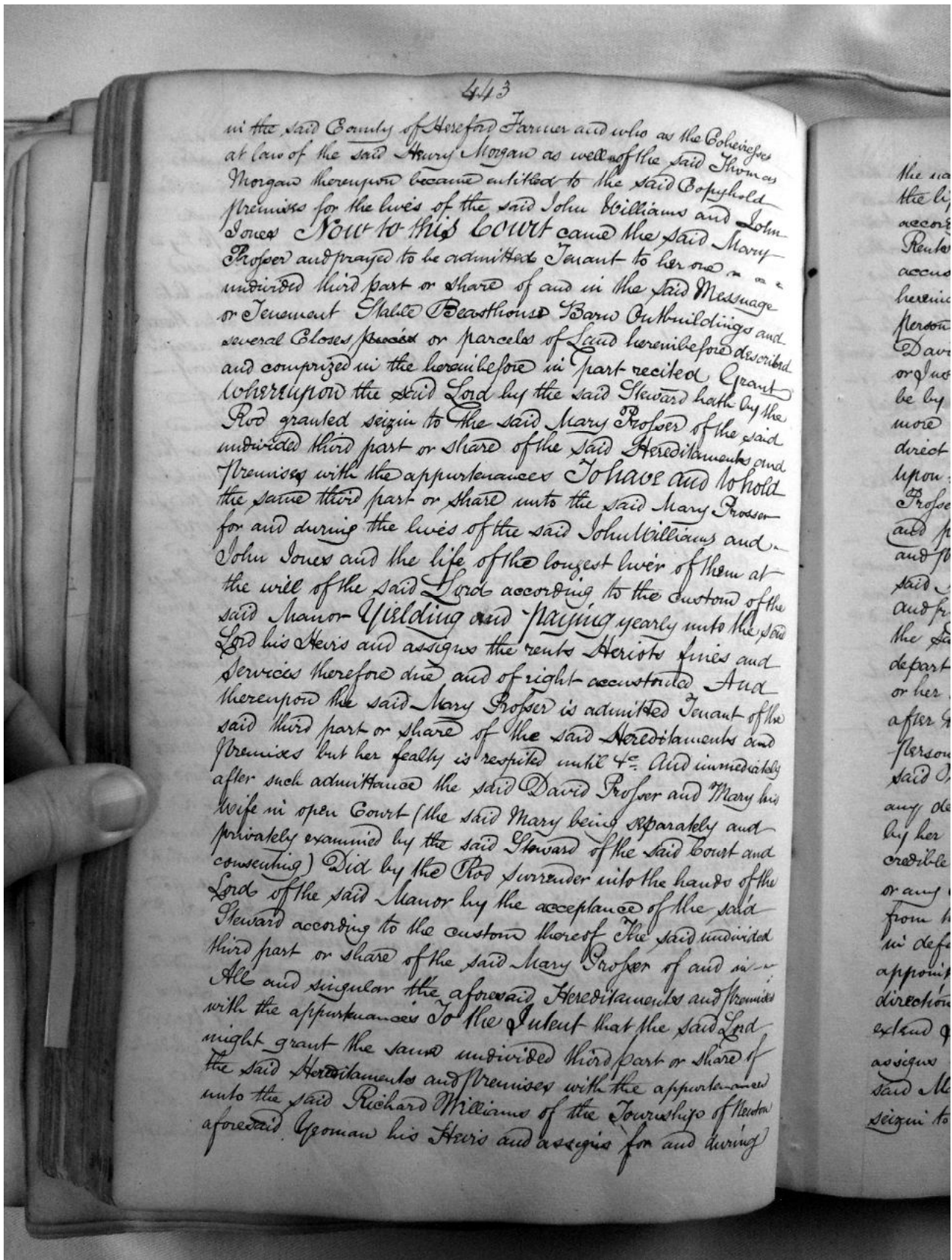
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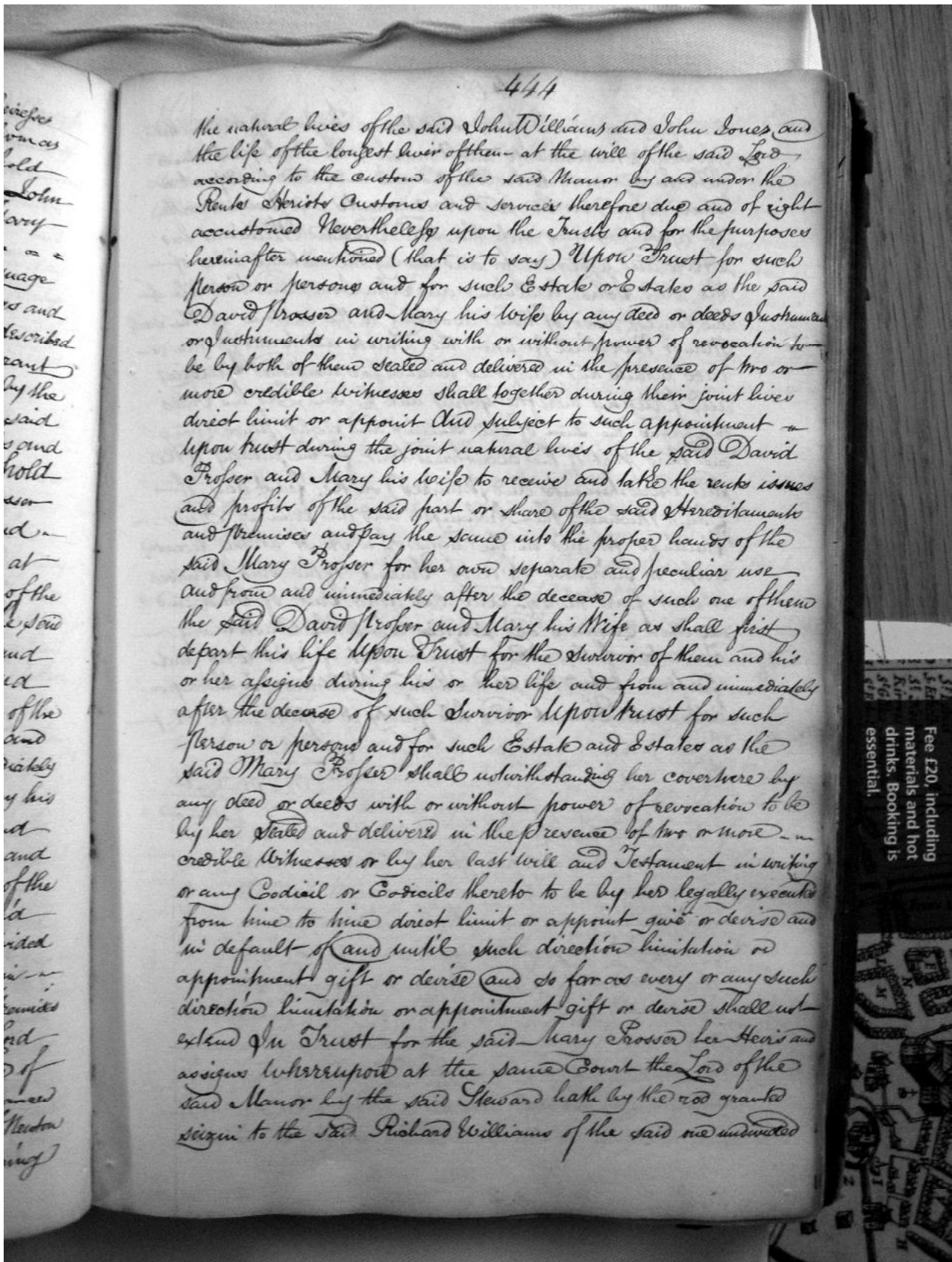
in the said County of Hereford Farmer and who as the Cohesives
 at law of the said Henry Morgan as well of the said Thomas
 Morgan thereupon became entitled to the said Copyhold
 premises for the lives of the said John Williams and John
 Jones Now to this Court came the said Mary
 Prosser and prayed to be admitted Tenant to her one
 undivided third part or share of and in the said Messuage
 or Tenement Stable Barnhouse Barn Outbuildings and
 several Close pieces or parcels of Land herebefore described
 and comprized in the herebefore in part recited Grant
 wherupon the said Lord by the said Steward hath by the
 Rod granted seisin to the said Mary Prosser of the said
 undivided third part or share of the said Hereditaments and
 premises with the appurtenances To have and to hold
 the same third part or share unto the said Mary Prosser
 for and during the lives of the said John Williams and
 John Jones and the life of the longest liver of them at
 the will of the said Lord according to the custom of the
 said Manor Yielding and paying yearly unto the said
 Lord his Heirs and assigns the rents Services fines and
 Services thereof and and of right accustomed And
 thereupon the said Mary Prosser is admitted Tenant of the
 said third part or share of the said Hereditaments and
 premises but her fealty is respited until 4th and immediately
 after such admittance the said David Prosser and Mary his
 wife in open Court (the said Mary being separately and
 privately examined by the said Steward of the said Court and
 consenting) Did by the Rod surrender into the hands of the
 Lords of the said Manor by the acceptance of the said
 Steward according to the custom thereof the said undivided
 third part or share of the said Mary Prosser of and in
 All and singular the aforesaid Hereditaments and premises
 with the appurtenances To the Intent that the said Lord
 might grant the same undivided third part or share of
 the said Hereditaments and premises with the appurtenances
 unto the said Richard Williams of the Township of Weston
 aforesaid Upon his Heirs and assigns for and during

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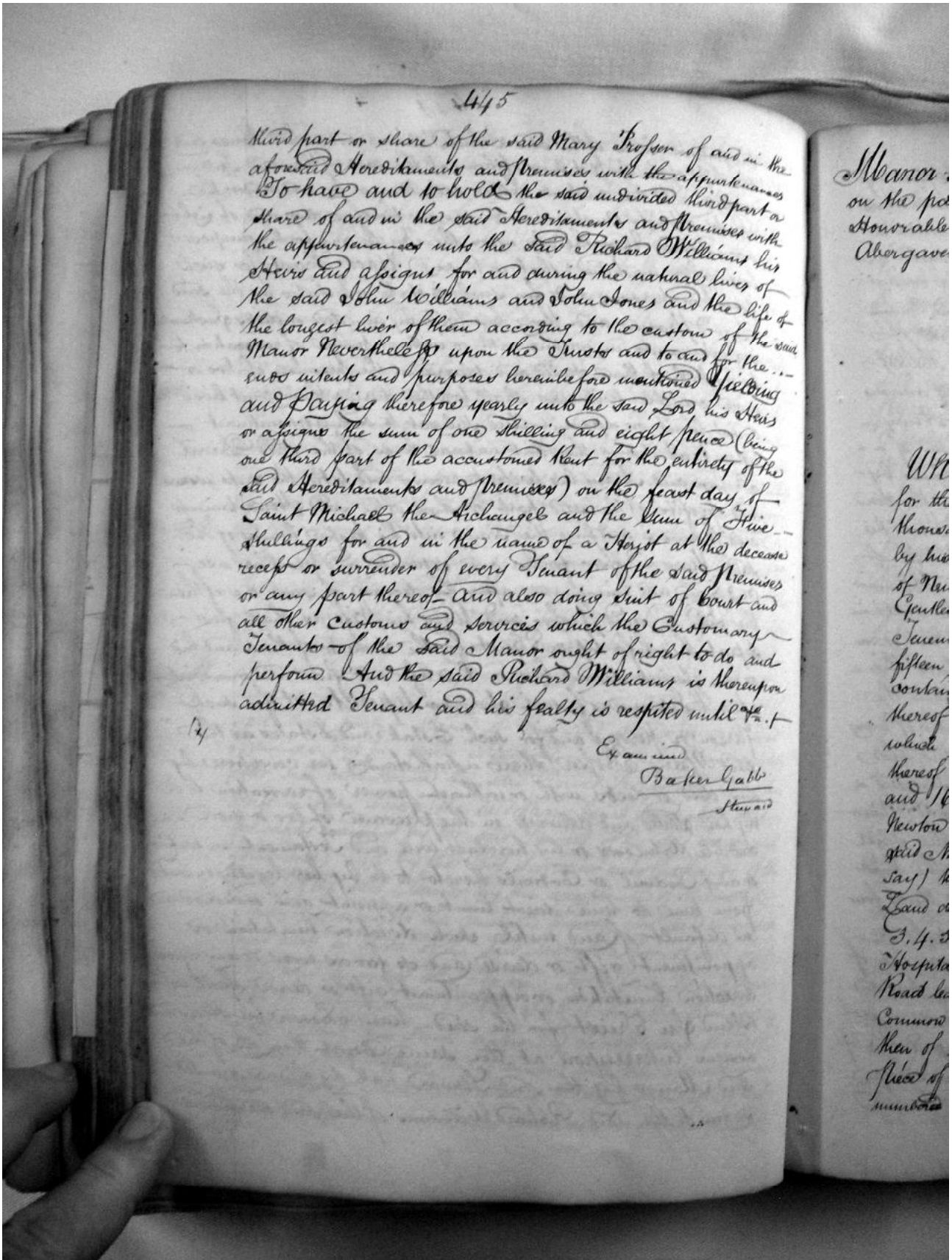
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third part or share of the said Mary Professor of and in the
 aforesaid Hereditaments and Premises with the appurtenances
 To have and to hold the said undivided third part or
 share of and in the said Hereditaments and Premises with
 the appurtenances unto the said Richard Williams his
 Heirs and assigns for and during the natural lives of
 the said John Williams and John Jones and the life of
 the longest liver of them according to the custom of the said
 Manor Nevertheless upon the Trusts and to and for the...
 such intents and purposes herebefore mentioned yielding
and paying therefore yearly unto the said Lord his Heirs
 or assigns the sum of one shilling and eight pence (being
 one third part of the accustomed Rent for the entirety of the
 said Hereditaments and Premises) on the feast day of
 Saint Michael the Archangel and the Sum of Five
 shillings for and in the name of a Heriot at the decease
 receipt or surrender of every Tenant of the said Premises
 or any part thereof and also doing suit of Court and
 all other Customs and services which the Customary
 Tenants of the said Manor ought of right to do and
 perform And the said Richard Williams is thereupon
 admitted Tenant and his fealty is respited until...

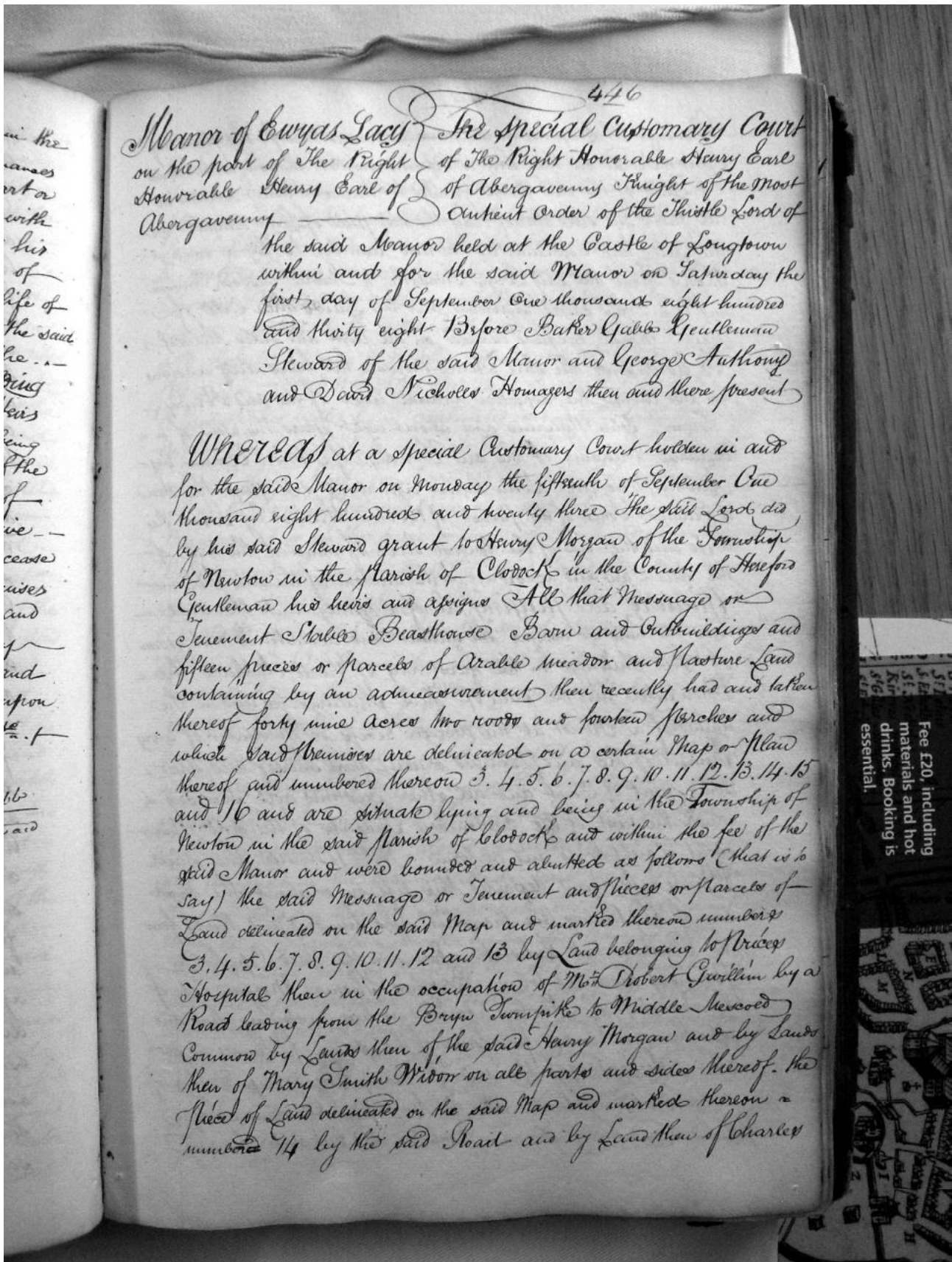
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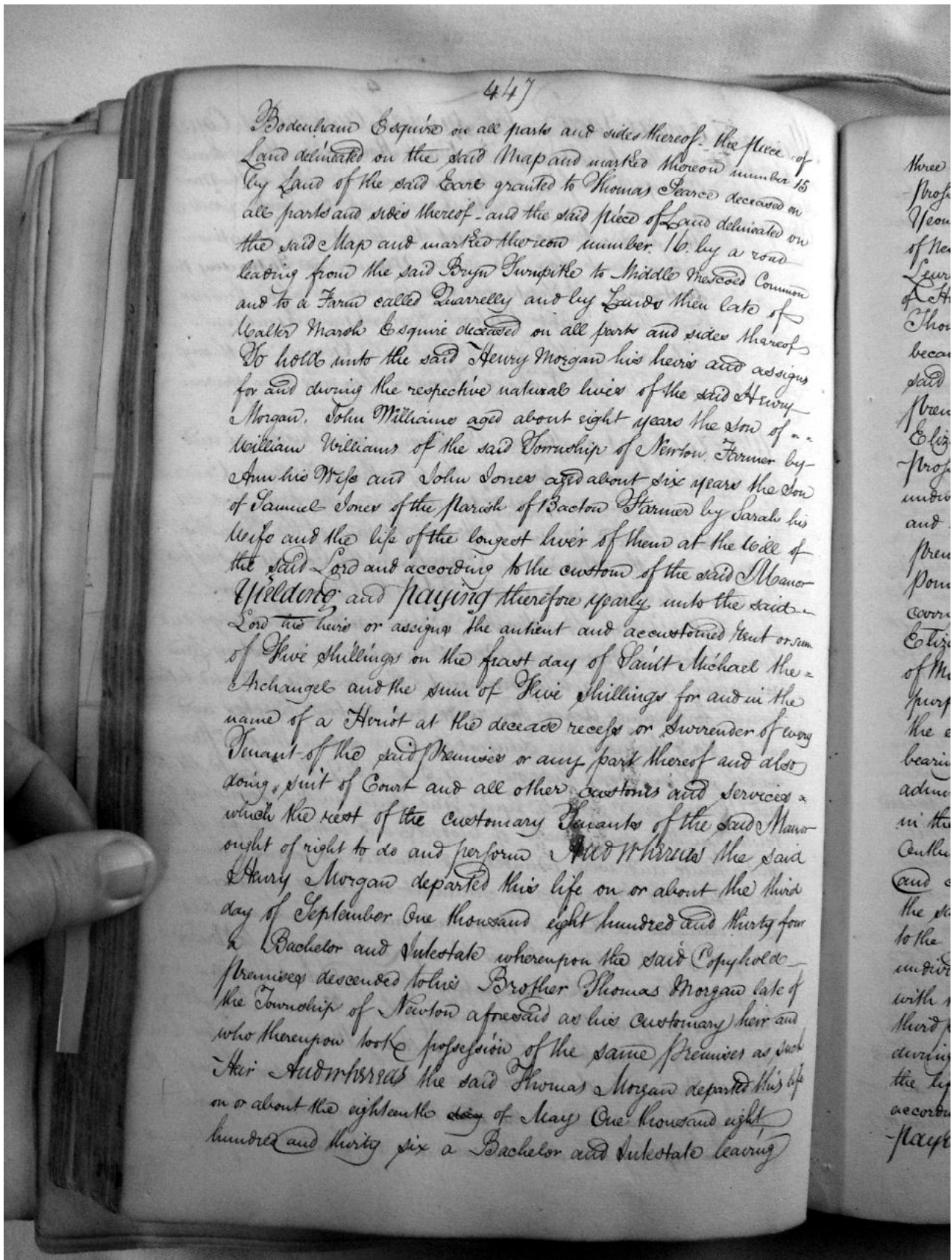


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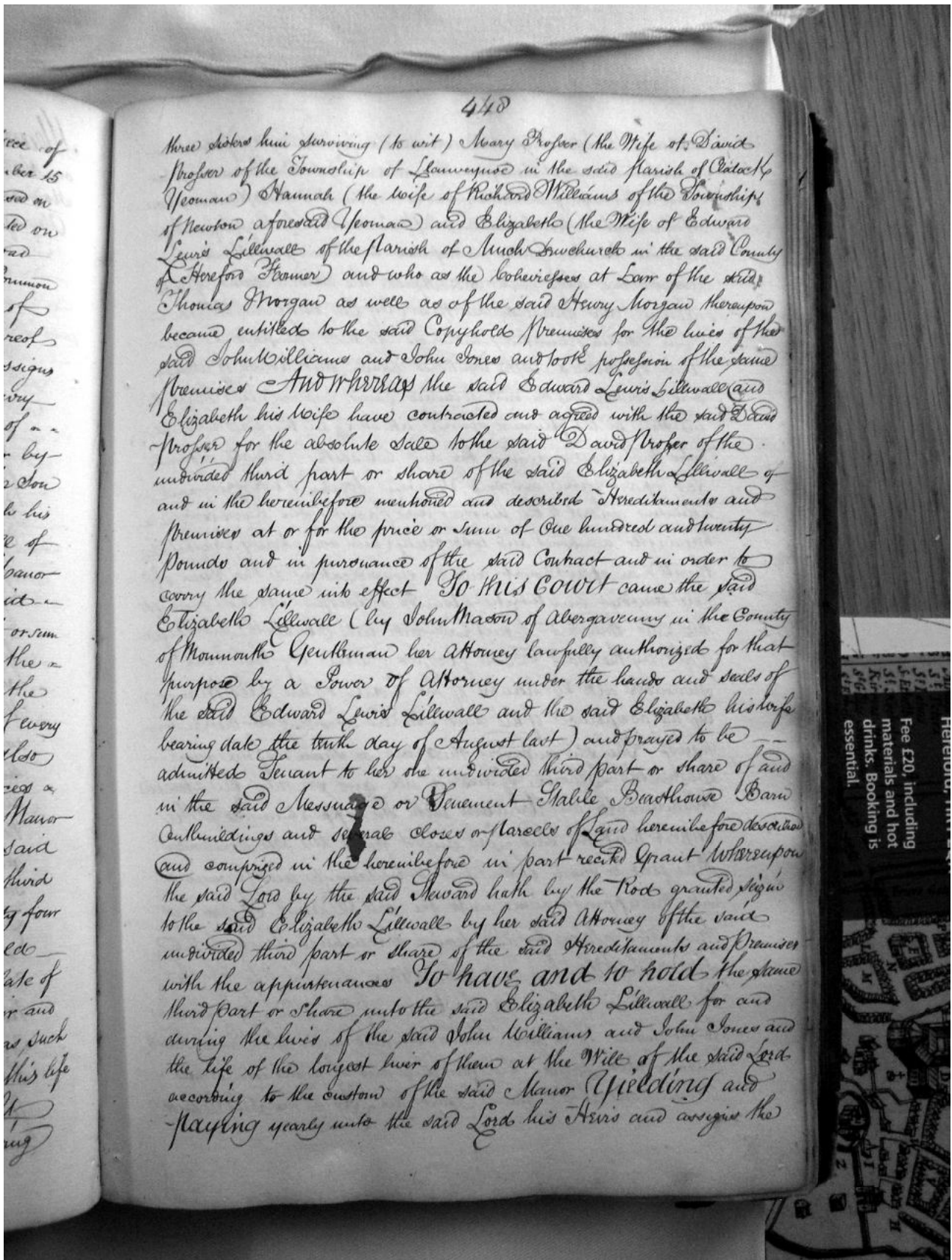

 Bodeham Esquire on all parts and sides thereof the piece of
 Land delineated on the said Map and marked thereon number 15
 by Land of the said Esquire granted to Thomas Parce deceased on
 all parts and sides thereof and the said piece of Land delineated on
 the said Map and marked thereon number 16 by a road
 leading from the said Bryn Tunpith to Middle Medcoes Common
 and to a Farm called Quarrelly and by Lands then late of
 Walter Marsh Esquire deceased on all parts and sides thereof
 do hold unto the said Henry Morgan his heirs and assigns
 for and during the respective natural lives of the said Henry
 Morgan, John Williams aged about eight years the son of
 William Williams of the said Township of Norton Farmer by
 Ann his Wife and John Jones aged about six years the son
 of Samuel Jones of the parish of Bacton Farmer by Sarah his
 wife and the life of the longest liver of them at the will of
 the said Lord and according to the custom of the said Manor
 of Wieldon and paying therefore yearly unto the said
 Lord two pence or assigns the ancient and accustomed Rent or sum
 of Five Shillings on the feast day of Saint Michael the
 Archangel and the sum of Five Shillings for and in the
 name of a Heriot at the decease receipt or Surrender of every
 Tenant of the said Premises or any part thereof and also
 doing suit of Court and all other customs and services
 which the rest of the customary Tenants of the said Manor
 ought of right to do and perform And whereas the said
 Henry Morgan departed this life on or about the third
 day of September One thousand eight hundred and thirty four
 a Bachelor and Duke of the said Copyhold
 Premises descended to his Brother Thomas Morgan late of
 the Township of Norton aforesaid as his customary heir and
 who thereupon took possession of the same Premises as such
 his Administrator the said Thomas Morgan departed this life
 on or about the eighteenth day of May One thousand eight
 hundred and thirty six a Bachelor and Duke leaving

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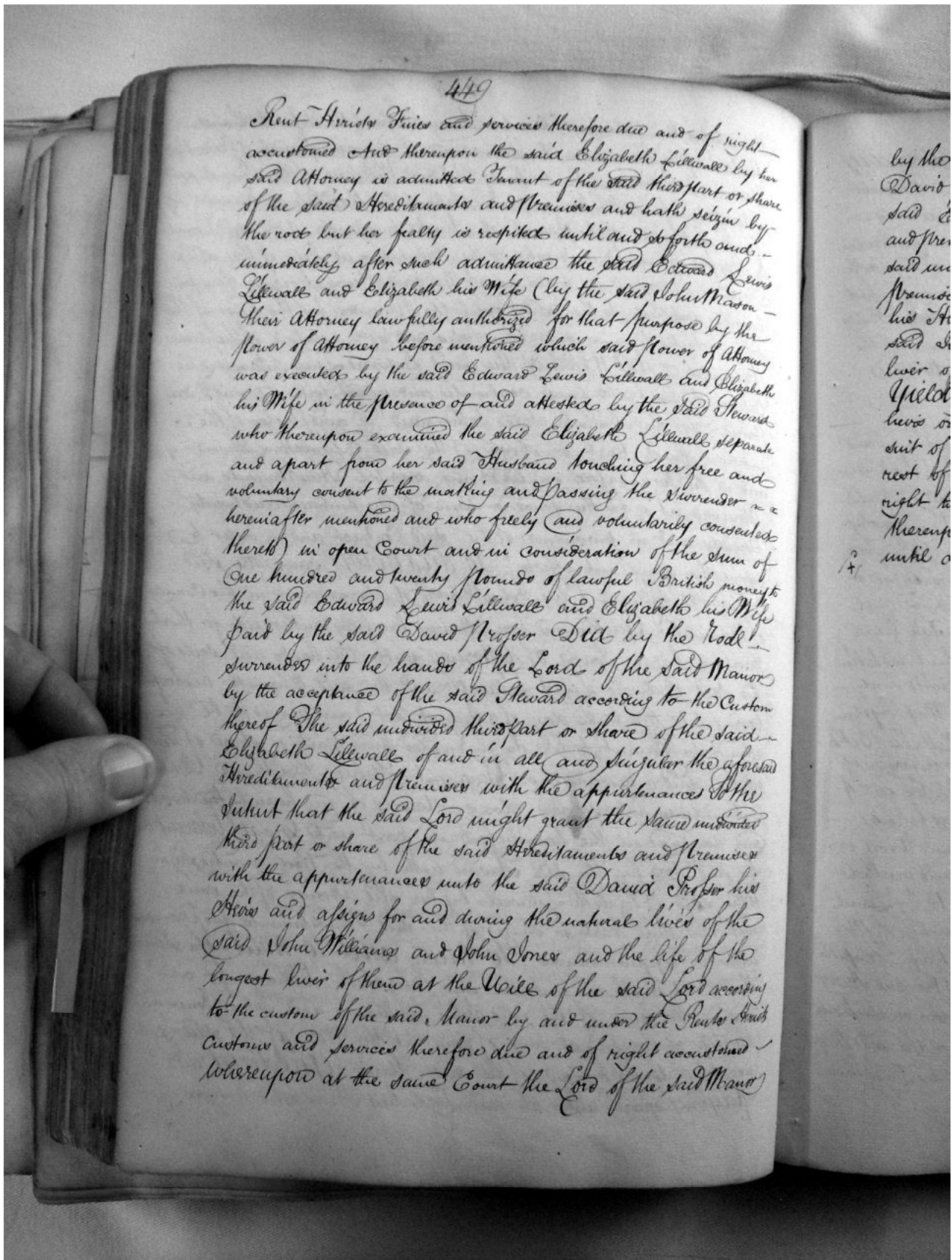
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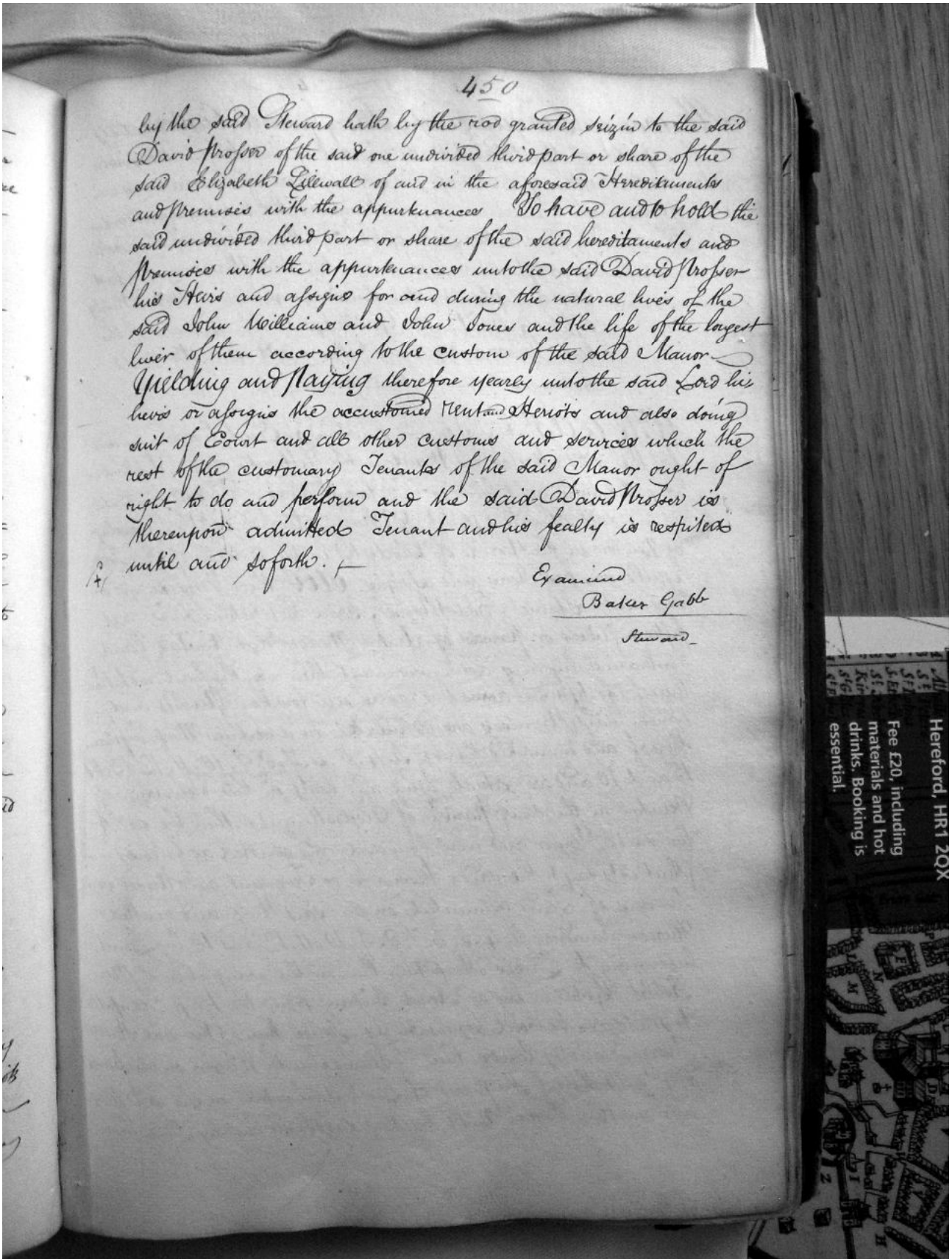
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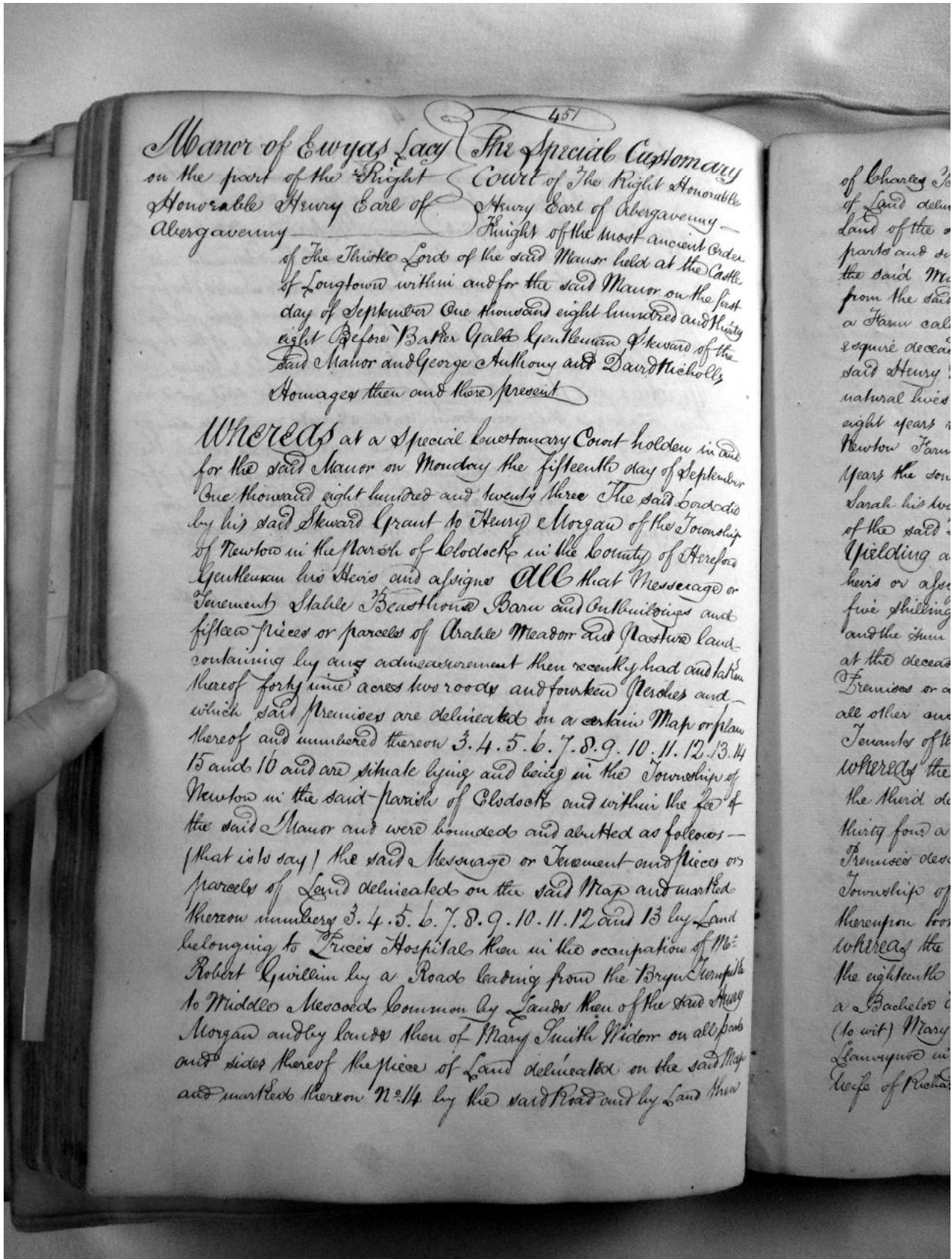

 more or less) situate lying and being in the parish of
 Michaelchurch Escley in the said County of Hereford and
 within the fee of this Manor which said Closes pieces or
 parcels of Land hereditaments and premises are delineated
 and the boundaries and abatements thereof set forth in the Map
 or plan thereof drawn at the foot of this Grant and were
 in the last Grant thereof made at a Court holden in and for
 the said Manor on the twenty second day of February
 One thousand seven hundred and eighty one thus described
 "Two Closes or parcels of arable Land containing together
 by estimation about two statute acres and an half also
