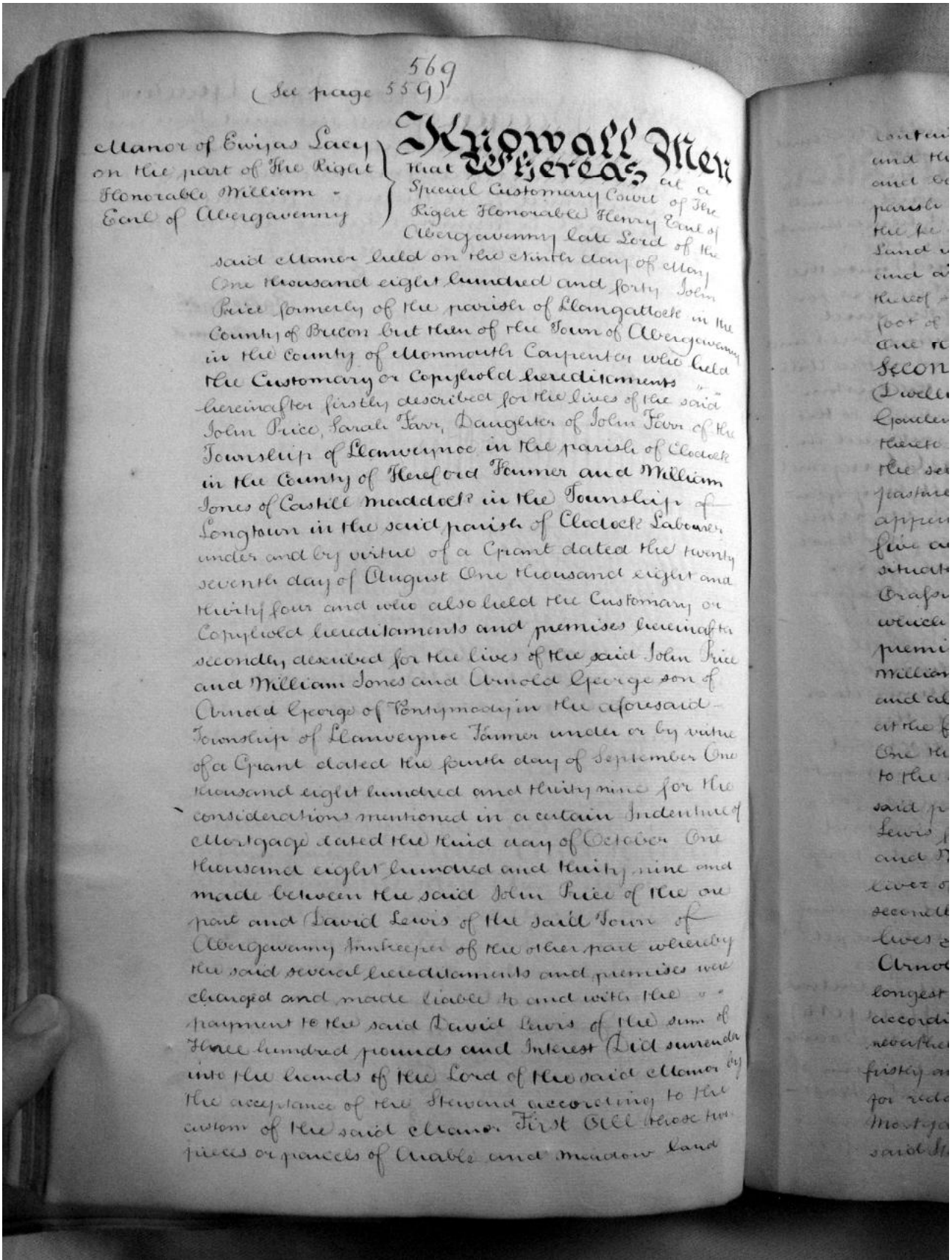

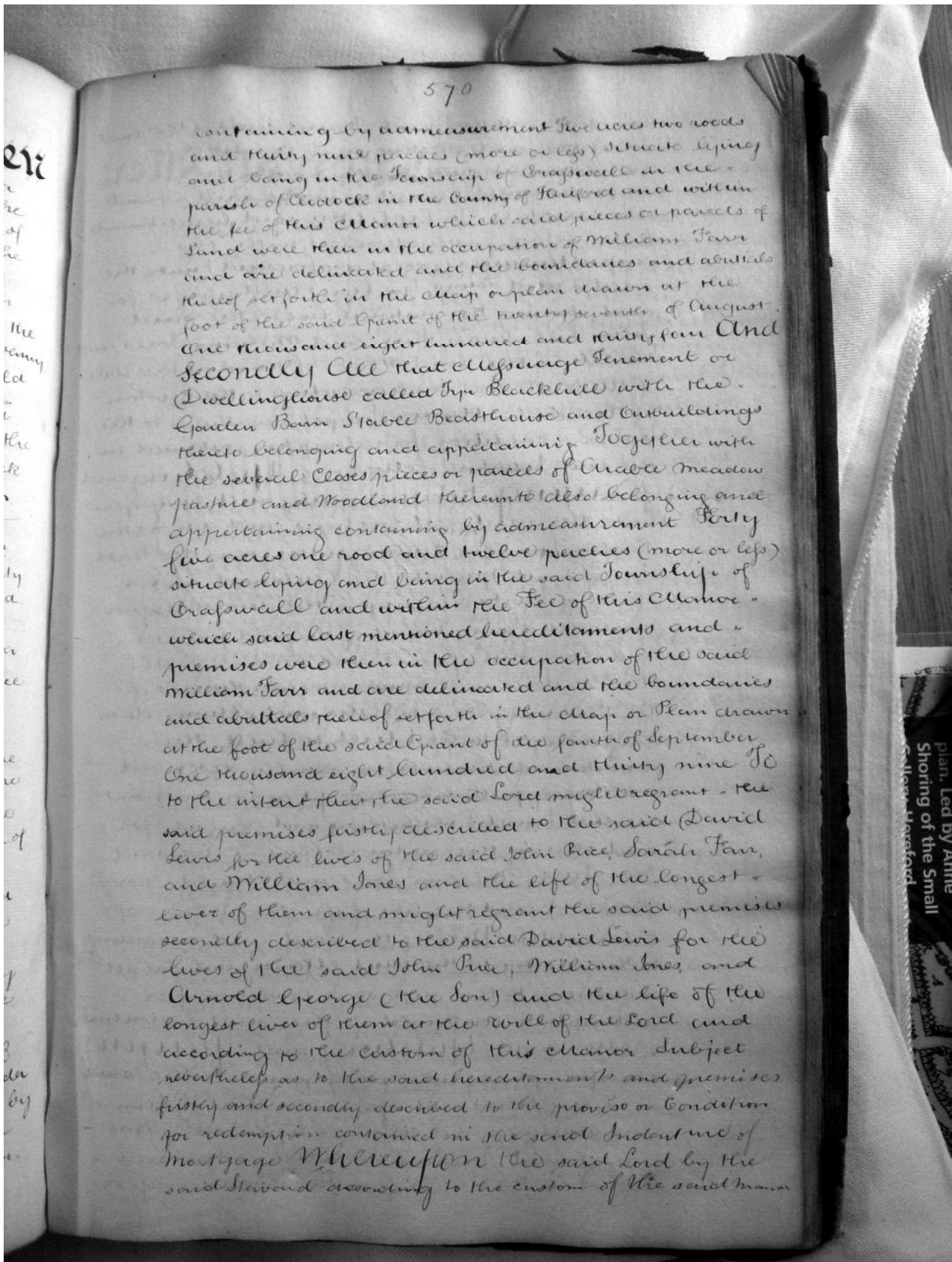

in the County of Hereford Farmer and William
Jones of Castell madocks in the Township of
Lontown in the said parish of Clecote Labourer
under and by virtue of a Grant dated the twenty
seventh day of August One thousand eight and
thirty four and who also held the Customary or
Copyhold hereditaments and premises hereinafter
secondly described for the lives of the said John Price
and William Jones and Arnold George son of
Arnold George of Tontymoogy in the aforesaid
Township of Llanveynoe Farmer under or by virtue
of a Grant dated the fourth day of September One
thousand eight hundred and thirty nine for the
considerations mentioned in a certain Indenture of
Mortgage dated the third day of October One
thousand eight hundred and thirty nine and
made between the said John Price of the one
part and David Lewis of the said Town of
Abergavenny Inkeeper of the other part whereby
the said several hereditaments and premises were
charged and made liable to and with the
payment to the said David Lewis of the sum of
three hundred pounds and Interest did surrender
into the hands of the Lord of the said Manor by
the acceptance of the Steward according to the
custom of the said Manor First All those ten

 that on the twenty second
 day of August in the year
 One thousand eight & 2
 hundred and fifty four
 at the town of Abergavenny

in the County of Monmouth the said Lord of
 the said Manor by Robert Gable of Abergavenny
 aforesaid Gentleman his Steward according to the
 custom of the said Manor in consideration of the
 sum of Two hundred and thirty pounds of
 lawful money of Great Britain to the said Lord
 paid by John Phillips of the Township of
 Cragwall in the Parish of Clodock in the County
 of Hereford Yeoman Did grant to the said John
 Phillips at the instance and request of said
 John Phillips by the Rod according to the custom
 of the said Manor All those several Closes
 pieces or parcels of Arable Meadow and Pasture
 land containing together Twenty nine Acres
 two roods and twenty two perches or thereabouts
 situate lying and being in the said Township of
 Cragwall and within the fee of the said Manor
 in as large and ample manner as the same were
 for many years held by Hugh Phillips the
 father of the said John Phillips and as the

 Kirkdale near Liverpool in
 the County of Lancaster a

Vinegar Brewer was at the time of his Bankruptcy
 seized of or well entitled to the Copyhold or Customary
 hereditaments hereinafter surrendered for the lives of
 Mary Trusted Spinster aged about Thirty years and
 Catherine Trusted Spinster aged about Twenty five
 years two of the daughters of Benjamin Trusted a
 heretofore of the Town of Hay in the County of Brecon
 Corn Factor) and Anna Mary Trusted aged about
 twenty years one of the Daughters of Thomas Trusted
 of the parish of Clrow in the County of Radnor Farmer
 and the life of the longest liver of them at the Will of
 the Lord and according to the custom of the Manor
 of Ewyas Lacy in the County of Hereford subject to
 the equitable charge hereinafter mentioned but free
 from other incumbrances **And** whereas on or
 about the sixteenth day of February One thousand
 eight hundred and forty seven the said Henry John
 Chambers deposited with Walter Morris the Title deeds
 relating as well to the said Copyhold hereditaments
 as also to certain Freehold lands as a Security for the
 sum of Three hundred pounds and interest **And**
 whereas on the second day of January One
 thousand eight hundred and forty nine a Fiat
 in Bankruptcy was awarded and issued against
 the said Henry John Chambers and his Francis
 Henry and they were thereupon duly found and
 declared Bankrupts and on the fifth day of January
 One thousand eight hundred and forty nine James
 Cazenove was duly appointed Official Assignee and
 on the twenty second day of the same month Malcolm
 M^r Cachen was duly chosen and appointed Creditors
 Assignee of the Estate and Effects of the said Bankrupts
